CITY COUNCIL TOUR

Mayor Fridal welcomed those in attendance for the Tour at 6:07 p.m. He excused Councilmembers Holmgren and Reese and informed everyone that Manager Warnke and Councilmember Deakin would join the Tour as soon as they could as they were attending the Planning Commission Meeting. Those in attendance were: Mayor Fridal, Councilmember Wood, Councilmember Doutre, Public Works Director Paul Fulgham and Recorder Hess.

Director Fulgham asked the group if they would like to see the new lights at the Public Works Shop that had been recently installed and the new generator which can be used for backup during a disaster or disruption of service. The generator can run 400 amps.

At 6:15 p.m., everyone loaded into the Senior Center Bus for the Tour. It was decided to deviate from the agenda order, so, after picking up Manager Warnke at the City Office at 6:21 p.m., they drove to Deweyville to see the Cedar Ridge Pump House first.

1. Salsnes Filter

Director Fulgham showed the group the new Salsnes Filter at the Treatment Plant. He explained the function, use of material, and how it operates. Councilmember Deakin joined the Tour at 7:19 p.m.

2. Cedar Ridge Pump House at 12440 North Hillcrest Drive, Deweyville, Utah

Director Fulgham drove the group to Deweyville where the Cedar Ridge Pump House is located. He showed the group the lines coming from the well, pressure running on each line and where the discharge lines run. He discussed the new well, how deep it is, water in the well, the need for additional property, the approximate location of the proposed new tank and how the lines running to Tremonton were bored or placed under the Bear River. Director Fulgham told the group that the Cedar Ridge well has a source protection

area. It runs 100 feet around the well. This source protection gives the City a time frame to fix a problem if the water were to be contaminated by an undetermined cause.

3. Adjournment.

Motion to adjourn was by consensus. The Tour ended at 7:31 p.m.
