UDALL 4-H

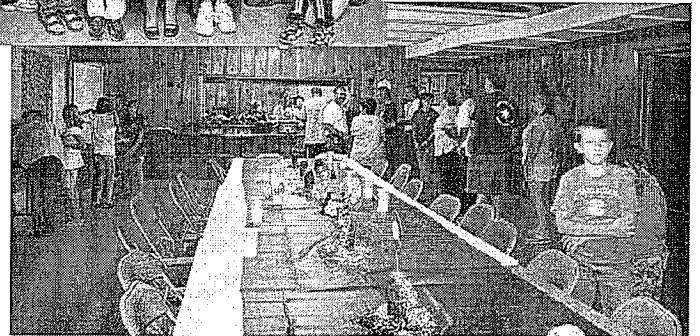
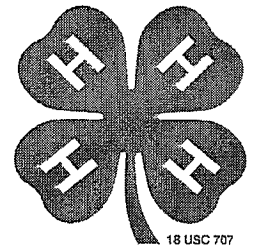
The Udall 4-H club has been busy the last year! The club has about 25 members and has been helping the community, learning new skills, becoming more responsible and meeting many new people.

The Udall City Council met in a Special Meeting on Tuesday, September 1, 2009, at 6:00 p.m., at the city building. Mayor Lette called the meeting to order. Roll call taken with the following council members present: Janette Adams, Steve Brown, Mary Hilderbrand and Randall Smith. Quorum established.

The council members reviewed information they received at an earlier work session for several proposals of playground equipment for the city park. Several options and versions of equipment were presented for consideration. After careful consideration the following motions were made.

MOTION: Brown moved, Hilderbrand seconded, approval of Option #1 Playset 61344 not to exceed \$30,000.00. All voted aye, motion carried.

MOTION: Hilderbrand moved, Brown seconded, approval of the Rock Blocks equipment not to exceed \$8,300.00. All voted aye, motion carried.

MOTION: Brown moved, Hilderbrand seconded, approval of the Pour in Place surfacing not to exceed \$16,000.00. This amount will be reduced by the \$4,300.00 Waste Tire grant to be received from the State of Kansas. All voted aye, motion carried.

The Udall City Council met in a Regular Meeting on Monday, September 14, 2009, at 6:30 p.m., at the city building. Mayor Lette called the meeting to order. Council Member Janette Adams gave the invocation. Roll call taken with the following council members present: Janette Adams, Steve Brown, Bob Clasen and Randall Smith. Mary Hilderbrand was absent. Quorum established. Also present were William Muret, Todd Mays, Lulita Hopkins, and Jerry Hansen.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

MOTION: *Clasen* moved, *Adams* seconded, approving the agenda as presented. All voted aye, motion carried.

GENERAL DISCUSSION: Review and Accept December 31, 2008 Audit Report The audit report received from Peterson, Peterson & Goss, LLP for December 31, 2008 has been reviewed by all council members. There were no journal entries for year-end 2008

MOTION: *Smith* moved, *Brown* seconded, acceptance of the 2008 audit as presented. All voted aye, motion carried.

It was discussed that Peterson, Peterson & Goss, LLP have served as the city's audit firm since 2005 and have suggested that as a municipality we go through the selection process and retain other accounting services. The City of Udall has received satisfactory service from Peterson, Peterson & Goss and it is no reflection on their work with the city. A letter of thanks will be sent from the Mayor.

MOTION: *Smith* moved, *Brown* seconded, directing the City Clerk to send out Request for Proposals to area accounting firms to serve as the city's public auditors. All voted aye, motion carried.

1. Donation to Udall Community Auxiliary for Fall Festival –

MOTION: *Brown* moved, *Clasen* seconded, donation to Udall Community Auxiliary of \$2,400.00 for Fall Festival. All voted aye, motion carried.

2. Donation to Miss Udall Pageant –

MOTION: *Clasen* moved, *Brown* seconded, donation to Miss Udall Pageant of \$100.00. All voted aye, motion carried.

A representative from KDHE, engineers, contractor, local utility services and city personnel were in attendance to discuss the approved plans for water line replacement.~~

MOTION: Brown moved, Clasen seconded, scheduling a special meeting on Monday, September 28, to determine the water tower color and to sign the papers to annex the property. All voted aye, motion carried.

2. Sale of 2001 Crown Victoria – Several options were discussed regarding the swapping out of the Crown Victoria engine into the maintenance pickup.

MOTION: Smith moved, Clasen seconded, approving up to \$1,350 to switch the motor and allow contractor to keep the vehicle, City keeps the rims and tire. All voted aye, motion carried.

1. Ordinance #629 adopting by reference the Standard Traffic Ordinances and Standard Public Offense Code, 2009 Editions.

MOTION: Clasen moved, Brown seconded, adoption by reference of the Standard Traffic Ordinances and Standard Public Offense Code, 2009 Editions. All voted aye, motion carried.

2. Application from the Udall Community Auxiliary for a temporary CMB license.

MOTION: Brown moved, Clasen seconded, approval of the temporary CMB license for the Udall Community Auxiliary. Three voted aye, Adams voted nay. Motion carried.

3. Ordinance #630 allowing for issuance of temporary CMB license to Udall Community Auxiliary.

MOTION: Brown moved, Clasen seconded, approval of Ord. #630 allowing issuance of temporary CMB license. Three voted aye, Adams voted nay. Motion carried.

4. Ordinance #631 establishing prices for open/close of gravesites at the Udall Cemetery.

MOTION: Clasen moved, Adams seconded, approval of Ordinance #631 establishing prices for open/close of graves at the Udall Cemetery. All voted aye, motion carried.

5. Review of website development proposals. Four proposals from various organization were presented to better develop the City of Udall website.

MOTION: Brown moved, Clasen seconded, approval of the website proposal from iGov at \$588 annually. All voted aye, motion carried.

Billman – Discussing with the Cowley County Sheriffs office and Wheat State telephone the possibility of having all calls to the local police number rolling over to 911 dispatch after 6:00 p.m. There are several details yet to be resolved. The Explorer's Program policy manual adapted from another organization has been reviewed and instituted for the department. Requested sending Officer Kochick to the part-time academy from November 2 to November 13.

MOTION: Clasen moved, Brown seconded, authorizing up to \$350 to supplement Joseph Kochick part-time officer training. All voted aye, motion carried.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

MOTION: Clasen moved, Adams seconded, approving the agenda as the two items designated in the regular meeting of September 14; annexation of water tower area and selection of water tower colors. All voted aye, motion carried.

1. Ordinance #628 annexing certain tracts of land within the limits and boundaries of the City of Udall, Cowley County, Kansas, and designating their zoning district.

MOTION: Smith moved, Hilderbrand seconded, approval of Ordinance #628 annexing the property adjacent to and the site of the water tower construction. All voted aye, motion carried.

2. The council members have reviewed the color selection booklet provided by the contractors. Randall Smith has researched the paint process finding that the current water tower is painted every five years; the new tower will be able to use a 15 year paint process. Other communities have used varying colors and find that with the "sundial effect" there is significant fading on some areas of the tower. The contractor reported that 90% of municipalities and water districts use tank white.

MOTION: Hilderbrand moved, Adams seconded, selecting tank white for the tower color and red for the lettering. All voted aye, motion carried.

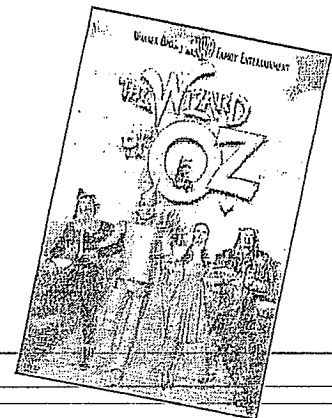
