"The Wonderful Wizard of Oz"

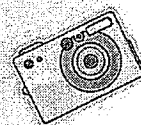

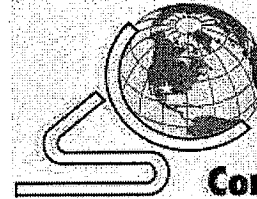

Udall Water Tower Nearing Completion

A change in the Udall skyline has been in progress over the last several weeks. The new water tower installation by Maguire Iron, Inc. has been both dramatic and exciting. Several streets in town have been the site of Duling Construction's crew placing new water lines to several areas, with more planned in Phase II of the project.

Preparation for painting of the water tower has now begun and the logo for the final touch is displayed on page 7.

The water tower and line replacement project began in 2007 with application by the City to the Kansas Department of Commerce Community Development Block Grant for a \$400,000 grant to enable the city to move forward with the project. This in addition to funding by Kansas Department of Health and Environment has made the project possible. As part of the financial requirements to demonstrate the City's ability to repay the loan, operational costs were evaluated and resulted in an increase in water rates in May 2008. Local sales tax funds currently received by the City of Udall were approved for funding utility operations and will be used as a portion of the repayment. There are no anticipated increases in water rates in the near future to pay for these improvements.

**MINUTES-REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
CITY OF UDALL**

Monday, October 12, 2009

Udall City Council met in a Regular Meeting on Monday, September 28, 2009, at 6:30 p.m., at the city building. Mayor Lette called the meeting to order. Mary Hilderbrand gave the invocation. Roll call taken with the following council members present: Steve Brown, Randall Smith and Mary Hilderbrand. Janette Adams and Bob Clasen were absent. Quorum established. Also attending were Jeremy Billman, Todd Mays, Rose Mary Saunders, Jerry Hansen, Jarek Brill, Bekah Benvin, Megan Leonard, and Lulita Hopkins.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

MOTION: Brown moved, Smith seconded, approving the agenda with two items added to new business, #8 Noon whistle and #9 Replacement of trees. All voted aye, motion carried.

GENERAL DISCUSSION

1. Todd Mays was recognized for his ten years of service to the City of Udall. Todd was presented a 10 year pin and a gift certificate to Neives' restaurant by the Mayor and city council.
2. Police Chief Jeremy Billman and Officer Steven Parker were both presented cards signed by the mayor, council and city staff congratulating them on the recent additions to their families, welcoming baby girls to each home.
3. The Mayor and council took a few minutes to thank the many individuals, organizations and businesses involved in the successful Fall Festival recently celebrated. All the city council members participated in the event, along with the Ladies Auxiliary, Udall Cooperettes, National Guard Reserve, S.U.N. Club, N.I.C.E. Committee, participation from several of the local churches and the Cowley County Sheriff's Office. Local businesses including Wheat State Telephone, Union State Bank, D's Place, Felt's One Stop, and Kistler's Service all contributed to the day's success. There was a record crowd attending the street dance in the evening with 600 wrist bands being sold. The mayor did remind the public there are a few items in the lost and found available for claim at the city building.
4. To be addressed fully under water supply project, it was resolved by Jerry Brown and Todd Mays that 160 feet of water line could be saved by relocating a main if two permanent easements could be acquired. The individuals involved, Dwight and Beth Ramsey and Susan Landis were contacted and granted the easements to the city. All involved were thanked for their contribution to improving on the presented plan and a more efficient water supply line.
5. Mayor Lette reminded the public of the notice published in the City Chit Chat on September 30.
The city of Udall would like to remind the community of the following City Ordinances on junked vehicles. Chapter VIII, Article 3 Section 8-301 through 8-313 states that all vehicles that cannot operate under their own power or be used for their constructed purpose must be removed from the property. All vehicles on public and private property must have current registration and insurance. The police department will begin issuing citations 30 days from the publication of this notice.

The thirty day time period will expire on October 30. This ordinance applies to both public and private property.

BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR:

CONSENT AGENDA:

MOTION: Brown moved, Smith seconded, approval of the Consent Agenda approving the minutes for the regular meeting of September 14 and special meeting of September 28, Treasurer's Report and Clerk's Report for the month of September 2009, and expenditure report in the amount of \$371,603.58. All voted aye, motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Water Supply Project – Rose Mary Saunders explained the delay in payments being approved to both Maguire Iron and Duling Construction due to the engineering addendum presented to Poe & Associates in April and not forwarded to the State of Kansas until September. The intervening draw downs on the grant and loan funds have not been approved because of this delay. She presented a budget spreadsheet showing \$705,489.78 in draw downs from April to September.

MOTION: Brown moved, Hilderbrand seconded, approval of Pay estimate #3 to Maguire Iron of \$140,100.88 and Pay estimate #1 to Duling Construction of \$154,657.90. All voted aye, motion carried.

Permanent Easements – Easements were obtained from Dwight and Beth Ramsey and Susan Landis for a portion of their property bordering on the vacated alley so the water line could be rerouted through the area. With this easements granted, Resolution #246 accepting the easements was prepared.

MOTION: Smith moved, Brown seconded, approval of Resolution #246 accepting the two easements from the Ramsey and Landis homeowners. All voted aye, motion carried.

2. The Crown Victoria has been delivered to B&L in Winfield for the engine switch to the maintenance pickup.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Micro Comm extended service warranty proposal

MOTION: Brown moved, Hilderbrand seconded, approval of renewing the Micro Comm extended service warranty in the amount of \$1,425.00. This extended telemetry service on the current water tower to the wells. All voted aye, motion carried.

2. Udall Neighborhood Revitalization – This program is now available in Winfield, Arkansas City and other surrounding communities. Pursuing with the involved taxing entities to see if Udall could also offer tax abatements on new or renovated properties would place Udall on a level playing field with other communities. Approval would only begin the process of securing permission from other taxing entities involved and beginning the process.
MOTION: Brown moved, Hilderbrand seconded, approval of beginning the Udall Neighborhood Revitalization program. All voted aye, motion carried.
3. Annual Report Identity Theft – a report was presented for the council's review that the Identity Theft program in place has been followed and there have been no attempts at identity theft detected.
4. Christmas Candy – It is time to order the candy for Santa Comes to Town. Prices have not been quoted from Nifty Nut House and will not be available until the end of October.
MOTION: Brown moved, Hilderbrand seconded, authorizing the order of candy from Nifty Nut House not to exceed \$600.00. All voted aye, motion carried.
5. Christmas Decorations – It was discovered the intersection pieces ordered for First and Main and Cowley 3 are not long enough for the areas involved.
MOTION: Brown moved, Smith seconded, authorizing additional decorations to be purchased from Wayne Manufacturing not to exceed \$1,600.00. All voted aye, motion carried.
6. Existing Christmas lights and decorations (displayed on poles in the downtown area). Discussion was held regarding whether to donate or try and sell the existing decorations. It was suggested to place the items on Kansas Government surplus or purplewave.com.
MOTION: Brown moved, Hilderbrand seconded, to appoint Bob Clasen and Janette Adams to determine the process to liquidate the existing Christmas decorations. All voted aye, motion carried.
7. Employee Handbook – table to next work session.
MOTION: Brown moved, Smith seconded, tabling this item to the next work session. All voted aye, motion carried.
8. Noon whistle – It has been suggested to discontinue the noon whistle due to disturbing shift workers trying to sleep and dogs barking. The siren system is tested on Tuesdays during the spring months by the Emergency Operations Center in Winfield.
MOTION: Brown moved, Hilderbrand seconded, discontinuing the noon whistle for a trial period of 60 days. All voted aye, motion carried.
9. Trees in the Park – The N.I.C.E. committee initiated this project of Memorial Trees in the city parks. The City of Udall maintains the trees once purchased through the N.I.C.E. committee's program. A few of the trees are needing replacement.
MOTION: Brown moved, Hilderbrand seconded, approval of the invoice from Brady Nursey in the amount of \$427.50. All voted aye, motion carried.

COUNCIL MEMBERS REPORTS:

Hilderbrand – Commented on the success of the Udall Fall Festival and the cooperation and teamwork by all the volunteers that made the day possible.

MOTION: Brown moved, Hilderbrand seconded, going into executive session for five minutes to discuss non-elected personnel calling legal counsel, Jeremy Billman and Lulita Hopkins. All voted aye, motion carried.

Meeting resumed at the proper place and time. No action taken.

MOTION: Brown moved, Hilderbrand seconded, approval of updating the paging system with P1 at \$920 annually and \$1,500 installation. All voted aye, motion carried.

STAFF REPORTS:

Hopkins – reported Request for Proposals for auditing firms will be sent out this week for review at the next meeting.

MOTION: Brown moved, Hilderbrand seconded, going into executive session to discuss non-elected personnel with right to call Jerry Hansen and legal counsel. All voted aye, motion carried.

Meeting resumed at the proper place and time. No action taken.

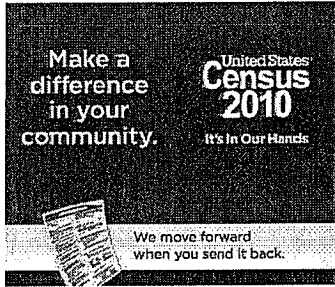

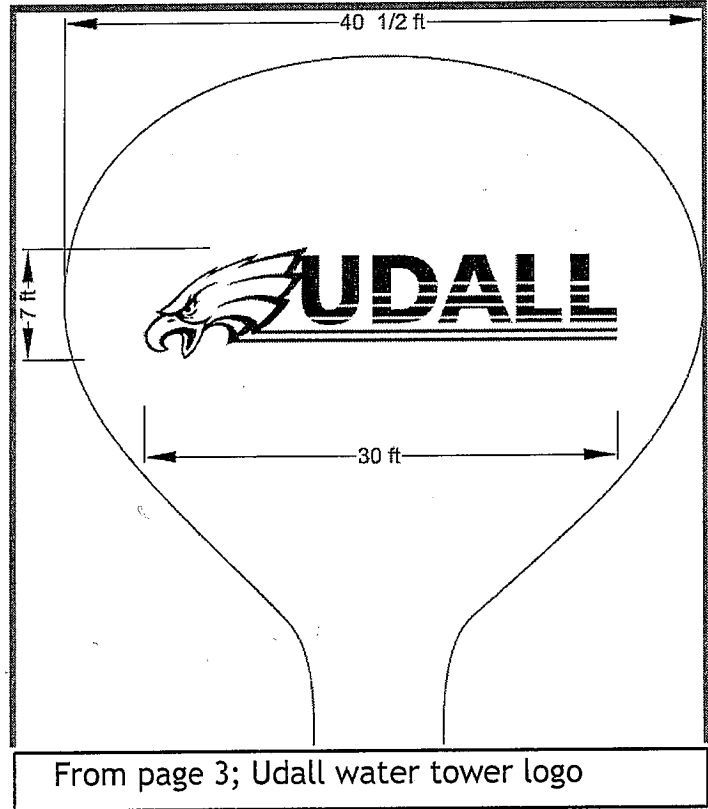

In March 2010, more than 130 million addresses across the nation will receive a census questionnaire in the mail. One of the shortest census forms in history, the 2010 Census questionnaire asks 10 questions and takes about 10 minutes to complete. Completing your census questionnaire is easy, important and safe, and your participation is essential to ensuring a brighter tomorrow for our community.

Required once every 10 years by Article 1 of the U.S. Constitution, the census will count every person living in the United States, both citizens and noncitizens.
