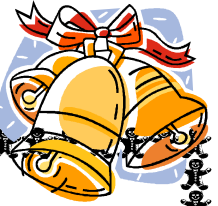

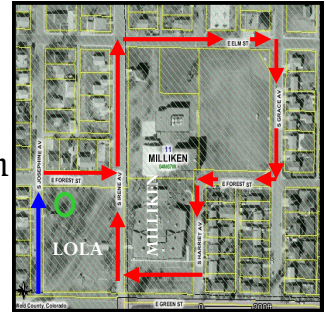

***Making it Tough for the Criminal***

*Milliken citizens can make things hard for potential criminals by decreasing their chances of a becoming a victim.*

1. *Never leave vehicles running and unlocked.*
2. *Always lock your vehicle doors at night and never leave any valuables such as purses, wallets and other goods. Prevents identity theft too.*
3. *Upgrade locks and lighting.*
4. *Lock doors and windows when leaving home.*
5. *Ask neighbors to watch for suspicious activity and report it to the Police immediately. Start a Neighborhood Milliken Watch. Call 356-1212 x 4.*
6. *Marking valuable property with an identifying number to discourage theft and help your law enforcement agency identify and return lost or stolen property.*
7. *Never leave your garage door open at night.*
