Item No. 2. Resolution No. 10-011: The Providence City Council will consider for adoption a resolution providing funding for Citizen Emergency Response Teams (CERT) participants. Paul Masuyama will give a presentation on the CERT

R Liechty said that Paul Masuyama came and asked the Mayor if the City would pay for citizens to attend the CERT program. The Mayor suggested that they train 18 citizens here in the City and the City pay for them. Paul Masuyama was very excited about this. Dave Low is CERT trained. The Mayor would like for the LDS Church to get their block captains involved in this training.

52 Paul Masuyama explained how the CERT program works. During a disaster the outlying areas will be the last areas to

53 receive help. Preparing the local citizens to help others survive until emergency services can reach them is essential. The

54 course is 8 weekly 3 hour sessions. The participants will be taught what to do during and after a disaster. The language that is 55 taught works with the Fire Department. CERT is an aid to the emergency responders. They help the largest amount of people

- 1 in the least amount of time. He is asking for support from the City. It is \$45 per student. This includes a helmet, vest and 2 manual.

- Item No. 3. Discussion: Blair and Cynthia Thompson are requesting an exception to Providence City Code Title 6 Motor Vehicles and Traffic, Chapter 2 Parking Regulations, Section 8 Winter Regulations.
- 16 R Liechty reminded the Council that this was discussed at the last meeting.
 - B Bagley said he went and looked at their property. He suggested they take out the trees in front of their home. There is also a soft culvert in front of their house.
 - B Thompson said he believes if they take the trees out they should have enough room to park. He talked about the ditch and what needed to be done with it.
- 21 D Astle said it looks like south of their house they could put two concrete strips for vehicle parking.
- 22 B Thompson said there is a utility easement in that area. They do want to be compliant with the parking regulations. He 23 wants the Council to understand their situation.
- 24 R Liechty said that the Tree Committee is working with Rocky Mountain Power to remove some of the trees in the City.
- 25 D Astle asked if they have checked with the Irrigation Company about the culvert.
- 26 B Thompson said they have not. The Thompson's piped the ditch a few years ago.
- 27 C Thompson asked how close to the sidewalk they were allowed to park.
- 28 R Liechty said they just can't park on the sidewalk.
- 29 D Low said he feels like the Thompsons need to comply with the ordinance.
- 30 B Thompson said they don't want to cause anymore problems. They want to make sure they are on the same page as the 31
- 32 D Low said most homes that have drive-ways lose property.
- 33 C Thompson said they have already given up property because of the driveway beside them that goes to the house behind 34 them. They don't feel they should have to give up anymore.
- 35 D Astle said if the Council allows them to park in the public right of way everyone will think its ok to park there. He feels 36 like they can put in a driveway on the south side of their home.
- 37 B Thompson said if Providence City will allow them to park eight feet off the asphalt they are in compliance.
- 38 D Astle said that is correct.
- 39 R Eck reminded the Council that curb and gutter could go down that street in the next couple of years.
- 40 R Liechty asked if the Council would be OK with taking out the trees.
- 41 D Low and J Russell said they weren't sure.
- 42 D Low doesn't believe the Council should cater to the Thompsons specifically.
 - D Astle said he believes you have to get permission to remove trees in the park strip.
- 44 B Thompson said they will wait and see what Rocky Mountain Power does with the trees.
- 45 D Low feels like this is a tough situation to deal with.

- 47 Item No. 4. Discussion: Susan Roberts will discuss the effects of the Spring Creek Parkway alignment change on her 48
- 49 Steve and Susan Roberts are owners of the Willows Miniature Golf Park and the property next to it. He sent the Council a 50 written detail of what is going on. He also told the Council some of the history behind it. They are concerned about the way
- 51 the new CMPO road is affecting their property. There is a triangle piece of property that is being created by this new road. 52 They are losing their frontage. They were told that this is a UDOT project and the City cannot work with them on this. They
- 53 want their property deeded back to them. They feel like this will impact their property.
- 54 R Liechty said the property they are talking about belongs to Providence City. How can you lose something that isn't yours?
- 55 S Roberts said they feel like things haven't been worked out with the issues. He talked about a letter that he wrote to the
- 56 Council. They want assurance that nothing will be done with this property in question. They got a letter telling them that they

57 need to deal with UDOT. S Bankhead said the City was told by UDOT that they needed to be very careful when meeting with the citizens. The City went through UDOT property acquisition. With the utilities under the right of way the City needs to keep the property. S Roberts said UDOT told them that Providence City did not want to meet with the Roberts. They don't feel like they have gotten this resolved in anyway. They feel like the City needs to deal with the problems this is causing. They feel like they are in the dark on this project. UDOT needs to work this out with them.

R Liechty suggested they do a meeting with himself, S Bankhead, R Eck and the Roberts and discuss this further.

The Council and the Roberts are OK with this suggestion.

Resolution No. 10-009:</u> The Providence City Council will consider for adoption a resolution approving the purchase of a truck with a utility bed (\$28,000) to be used jointly by the Water and Sewer Departments; and a \$14,000 loan from the Sewer Fund to the Water Fund to be repaid in two equal installments to be paid annually beginning in Fiscal Year 2011.

S Bankhead said this should be Resolution No. 10-012.

R Eck went through the handouts that he gave to the Council. He explained what the truck does everyday during work hours. There is a lot of starting and stopping. This is a lot of wear and tear on these trucks. The truck that this one will replace is a 1990. It has almost 100,000 miles. We are using a lot of money to keep this truck on the road. He read a recommendation from Steve Burruss Automotive on the condition of this truck. We can get a great deal with our State Contract. The Mayor and S Bankhead got a chance to look at the truck that the City would like to purchase. He is asking the Council to please approve the purchase of this truck. There is money in the budget for this truck.

B Bagley asked about depreciation.

S Bankhead said that is an option.

R Eck said we will try to surplus this truck and another one we have this summer.

B Bagley asked what the warranty is on this truck.

<u>Item No. 7. Discussion:</u> The Providence City Council will discuss a proposed ordinance amending Providence City Code Title 10 Zoning, Chapter 1, Section 4, Definitions, by adding the definition for Business Office – General, Business Office – Low Impact, Business Office – Medium Impact, Fitness Center Commercial (Gym) and amending Providence City Code Title 10 Zoning, Chapter 6, Use Regulations, by adding the following uses to the use chart: Business Office – General, Business Office – Low Impact, Business Office – Medium Impact, Fitness Center Commercial (Gym) in some or all of the City's zoning districts and adding 'Use is allowed as a permitted or conditional use only if it is a home business, child care business or nonconforming business that complies with Title 3, Chapter 4 of this Code, Conditional Businesses.

- S Bankhead said the Planning Commission has been working on this for quite a while. The first part of these definitions is to separate the business offices. The second part is from Mike Shetler, from Gold's Gym asking for a fitness center definition.
- 51 Bruce Baird and KC Bills from Amsource helped to come up with the fitness center definition. The third part is in the use
- 52 chart and it is adding definitions. She went through the ordinance and explained the changes that the Planning Commission
- has suggested. The Planning Commission held their public hearing on this item. They feel like this is ready for the Council to look at.
- R Sneddon said the Planning Commission feels like they did their homework on this.
- R Liechty said he wants to make sure of the percentage for incidental use when this comes back for action.
- 57 S Bankhead told the Council what the definition for incidental use is.

1 R Liechty asked if the Council would like for this to come back as an action item for the next meeting. He also wants to know what the percentage for the incidental portion will be. 3 4 5 6 7 8

D Astle wants to make sure that incidental is defined.

B Baird said you could have the input from the Commission after tomorrow night.

S Bankhead said we are in the pending ordinance stage.

STAFF REPORTS:

R Eck said Rocky Mountain Power is updating the power line that is going up to the Foxridge area. There is no permit required. The green waste bins will be here the first week in April. There will also be a City wide clean-up in April. The church wants to clean up all the parks in April.

S Bankhead reported that staff has met with GBS Benefits. They are an insurance broker. This looks very promising.

We should be getting some quotes shortly. Baseball and Softball registrations will end on March 25th. The Beehive league will be on our baseball fields this summer. We have 3 teams that will use our field as their home field. She talked about the fees that are charged for using our fields. Public Works will be hiring a new employee shortly to replace Sam Wentz.

Tentative budgets will be talked about the first meeting in May. Sales tax revenue is at 69%. Property tax revenue isn't available yet.

COUNCIL REPORTS:

D Calderwood attended the Planning Commission and the Historical Preservation meeting.

B Bagley met with R Eck to find out how he runs the Public Works. They also talked about the access to the Maceys area. There needs to be some ground work laid there. They discussed some of the concerns with the Amsource area. There are a lot of office complexes and doctor's offices on the north side of town. He feels like we really need to better control the commercial on the south side of town.

D Astle said he has had a lot of questions on the power poles. He talked about the DRC meetings. He has talked to Carl Seethaler about the Historic Preservation Committee. The monument will be cleaned up this week.

D Low said he was asked why part of the Historic Preservation Committee isn't citizens.

D Astle said it is not required by the ordinance.

D Low said a love for Providence and living in Providence isn't the same thing. Why is the percentage so high?

D Astle said most of the people on the Commission have spent many years living in the City. They have a real interest in the City. He doesn't feel like living in the City should be a requirement.

S Bankhead said they were looking for people who understood historic buildings. She agrees that it would look politically correct to have citizens on the board. She feels like everyone on the Committee has a soft spot in their heart for Providence

34 D Astle said they are looking at the Commission members. Some of them would like to step down. He would like to provide 35 training for them.

36 D Astle said that he received an email from a citizen concerning the decision by the Historical Preservation Committee on the accessory dwellings.

B Bagley talked to North Logan about their accessory dwelling ordinance. He feels like our ordinance needs to be clarified.

R Eck said DRC doesn't feel like we should be too specific.

D Astle said an accessory dwelling is an independent area in your home.

D Calderwood said he talked to a number of people about accessory dwellings. Everyone agreed with the Council decision.

R Liechty thanked the Council for their support on the CERT program. Everything is going very well with the City.
