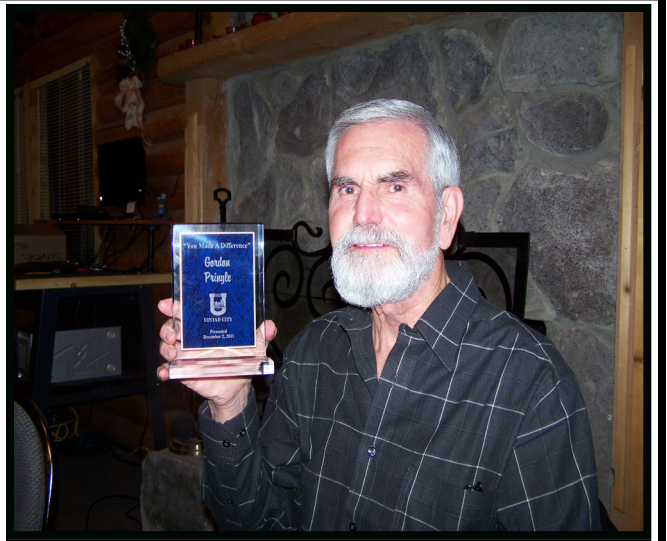

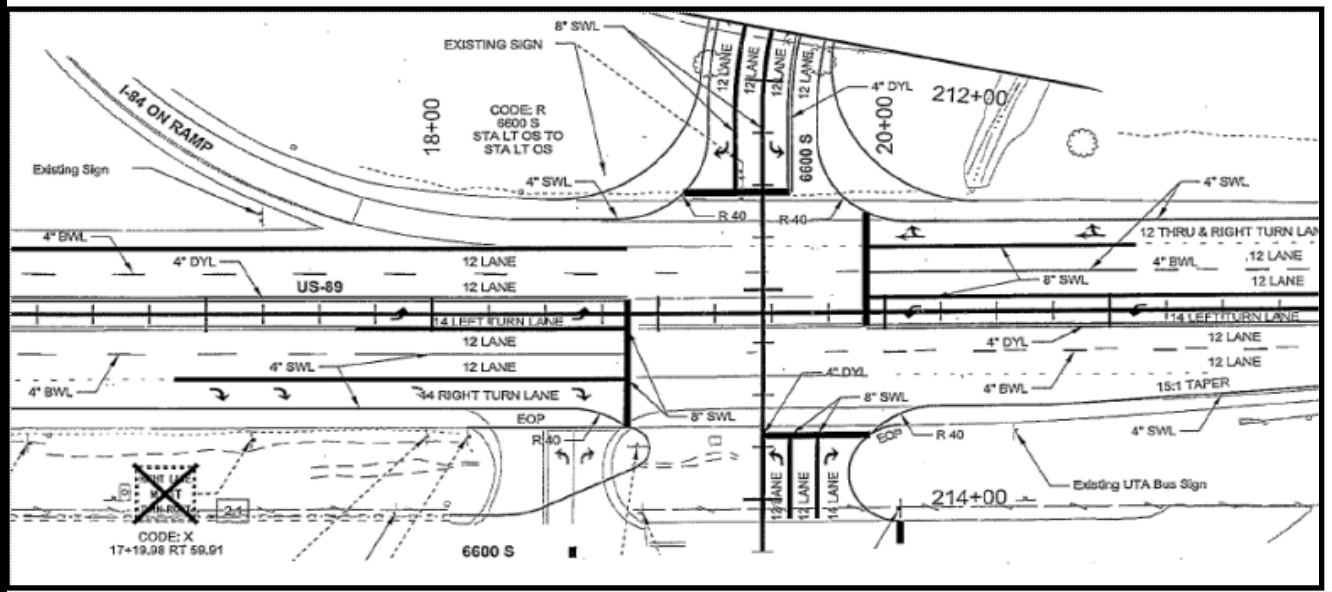

CITY UPDATES

Animal Control - The contract provider for animal control is Weber County. Licensing for dogs in the City will take place during March and April. To help facilitate the change, one day each month someone will be at the City Office so that you can license your pet. If you will not be able to come in during the time that Weber County will be at the City Office you can go to the Weber County Animal Services located at 1373 North 750 West (located by the Golden Spike Fairgrounds). Their hours of operation are 8 am to 5 pm, Monday through Friday. If you have questions, please call Heidi Flitton or you can call Weber County Animal Services at 801-399-8244, this number is for questions only. If you have a dog related issue the number to call is Weber County Dispatch 801-629-8221. A animal control enforcement officer will be dispatched to deal with the situation.

HWY 89 - As you know, construction is slated to start in the spring of 2012. The latest information is that at the intersection of 6600 South there will be 4 lanes at the intersection, one receiving lane and 3 lanes exiting onto US-89. There will be a right turn lane, a center thru lane, and a left hand turn lane. See picture below.
