NUISANCE ORDINANCE

The city has completed the first round of nuisance violations inspections. Violators will be receiving Notices in the mail soon. We specifically looked for piles of junk and/or debris, weeds over 6 inches tall, and unlicensed vehicles. If you have questions or concerns regarding your Notice please let us know. ROADS

GARBAGE AND RECYCLING COLLECTION

The garbage and recycling ordinance was revised. Garbage disposal costs the City and recycling disposal pays the City. In an effort to encourage recycling, collection rates are set to encourage recycling. When a customers recycling more they will pay a lower rate.

The new rate schedule which is effective May 16th for garbage and recycling is as follows:

- CATEGORY 1 - Residents with one (1) garbage tote and no (0) recycling tote
- CATEGORY 2 - Residents with one (1) garbage tote and one (1) recycling tote
- CATEGORY 3 - Residents with one (1) garbage tote and two (2) recycling tote

Explanation of "Tier": "Tons" refer to the number of tons of recycling material removed from the city each month. Billing on tier changes occur on the month following the report from Waste Management.

*6 Yard Dumpster	Delivery and pickup \$70 (one dump included) \$70 for each additional dump.				

* 6 Yard Dumpster for waste collection are available during the months of May to September each year under the following guidelines:

1. The resident's monthly utility account must be current.
2. Fees for the use of the dumpster are charged to the utility account.
3. All dumpsters are collected at the end of September.
4. Businesses are not allowed to use the dumpsters.
5. Dumpsters cannot be rented for debris from roofing, remodeling, etc.

Collection of recycling materials will be provided bi-weekly (every-other-week) on the same day as collection of solid waste trash, which is provided weekly.

RECYCLING FACTS IN UINTAH

The waste and recycling figures are in for January, February, and March of 2012.

If we as a community can recycle up to 10 or 11 tons per month, we will reduce individual costs to you, the city resident. The city-wide goal is to get a balance of waste and recycle tonnage. RAILROAD

As a faithful reader you noticed that I announced last month, that there would be "A Surveillance Review" to decide on the approval of crossing arms at the railroad crossing at 2275 East 6600 South. The request was approved. By the end of August they should be installed and functioning. They will be funded from the Utah State safety budget. With the anticipation of crossing arms on the two major crossing, steps are now being taken to possibly create a Quite Zone.
