

# Christmas Tree Napkins

## Materials:

**Fabric:** 2 Christmas prints or colors (remember that red fabric can bleed, so be sure to check colorfastness). 2 yards will give you about 6 15" circles

**Thread:** 1 spool Woollie Poly or PolyYarn serger thread (for rolled hem). If you want a bit of sparkle on the edge, you can use Razzle Dazzle.

**Thread:** 2 spools regular serger thread; color match the fabrics or the other thread.

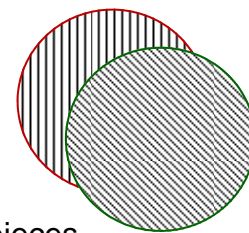
**Spray adhesive** (recommended)

**Fray Block** (recommended)



## Construction:

1. Pre-wash and iron all fabrics before cutting.
2. Cut out circles -- 15" is a good size. Use a large plate or a compass as your marking tool.
3. Take one circle of each fabric, and put them together with **WRONG SIDES** together. **IMPORTANT:** be sure to offset the grain of each fabric by 45 degrees. Grain runs up and down, and left to right. When you offset them by 45 degrees, you won't have a problem with serging on the bias. We used a temporary spray adhesive like KK2000 or 101 Quilt Basting Spray to hold the pieces together. This will wash out or just disappear on its own.
4. Set your serger to do a three-thread rolled hem, with the Woollie Poly in the upper looper and standard thread in the right needle and lower looper. **DO A TEST RUN** on some scrap fabric.
5. Serge a rolled hem around each pair of circles. You can use Fray Block to keep the thread ends from unraveling.
6. Fold each napkin as shown in the pictures.
