The final main improvements on the Soccer Park have been recently completed, including some additional fences, concrete walkways, landscaping, painted parking

spaces, etc. There is even a new building for restrooms and a small concession stand at the Soccer Park. There will also be some additional fencing and improvements at the tennis/basketball court at the main Perry Park. Note that all of these recent parks improvements have been completed with parks impact fees (which may only be spent on new parks facilities) and a County-wide tourism grant (which is funded by taxes generated from local restaurants and businesses).

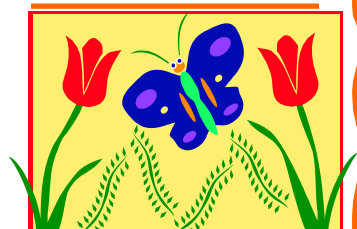

All the residents of the City of Perry are invited to participate in the seventh annual GARAGE SALE SATURDAY. This event will be advertised in four Northern Utah papers. All you have to do to participate is to have a garage sale on Saturday, May 19th. You should be ready to sell at 8am and stay open until 12 noon. Early birds will be discouraged. A map will be printed showing the streets of Perry and where the garage sales will be. The maps will be available at the Maverik Convenience Store beginning Friday morning the 18th. To have your garage sale listed on the map or for more information contact Tom or Terry Peterson at 723-3987. We need to have your listing before May 17th. This is a great opportunity to do your spring cleaning and get rid of some of that unwanted stuff. There is no charge for participa-



tion and Perry City will be paying for the advertizing and printing of the maps.

CROSS CONNECTIONS ARE ILLEGAL

The secondary water has been turned on and is ready for use. Do not over water or allow your sprinkler/hose to run unattended. A cross connection is when any source of water is interconnected with city culinary water (i.e. interconnected with pine view water or other secondary water). This is illegal!! Perry City Ordinance 91-01, Utah State Code Section 19-4-112, and International Plumbing Code Section 608-6 all prohibit this connection. Violation of the above is a Class B Misdemeanor and penalties include from \$1000-\$5000 for each day of violation. Penalties are defined in Utah State Code Section 19-4-109. If you have any questions, contact Paul Nelson, Perry City Public Works Director.
