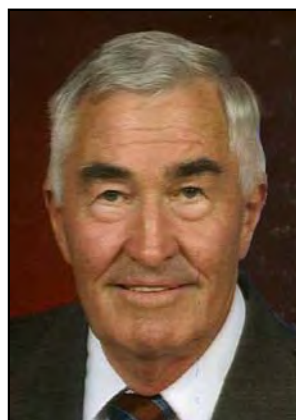
One added pleasure came in 1990 when my wife, Sally, began working at Westmoor as a Career Center Aide and English teacher.

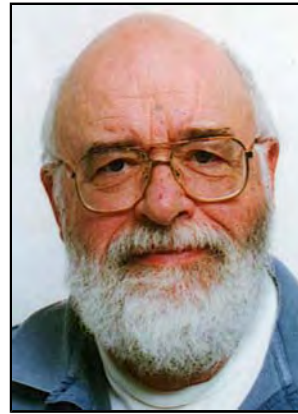

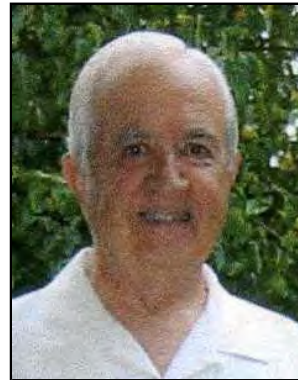

John A Brignola, after moving from San Francisco, briefly moved to Scotland to teach. After a couple of years in Scotland, he landed a position as headmaster in the early 1960s for the Italian-American school in Naples, Italy. As a Headmaster and teacher in this institution, he was involved in the daily running of the school as well as teaching. He taught English to the Italian children. He also taught American children in several academic organizations whose parents were in the Military at the NATO base there in Naples. Here John stayed for the remainder of his life, visiting his family in Troy, NY from time to time.

As a side note, he was the eighth of nine children and three of them became teachers and two of them Doctors. He retired from teaching in the late 80's. Unfortunately, he developed Parkinson's disease in that same time and in December 1992, he passed away in Italy. He loved Italy so much, and the town where his father was born, that he wished to be buried there at the family crypt.

Eighteen years later, he is still missed and loved by those of us in the family and those he touched through his teaching profession.

Eunice V. Coupe (1912-2002), BA and MA, UOP; taught Spanish at Westmoor (1960-63) before transferring to Serramonte HS, where she was voted Teacher of the Year. Mrs Coupe previously taught at EJ King HS in Sasebo, Japan; at George Washington HS in Agana, Guam; at Norfolk Catholic HS in Virginia; and at Athens HS in Georgia (where Fran Tarkenton was one of her students).

After retiring in 1973, she settled with her family in Los Altos Hills and achieved a #7 national ranking in senior ('70's and '75's) tennis.

Two of her four children (Dennis and Jeffrey) graduated from Westmoor.

It doesn't summarize David's life because I really know too little of it to relate it here; it doesn't speak of his marriage to his first wife who bore his two children – I knew none of them, nor does it speak much of his second wife, Rose Marie Ferrante, whom I did have the pleasure of meeting during one of my visits to the home where David was being cared for in his last years. Rather, it is written by one of David's students, Len Jacobson (Class of 1960). And when you get to the end of it, you'll see it is more of a public apology for my immature behavior as an adolescent than it is a summary of a man's life. But I feel better for having written it.)

David R. Ferrante was born on August 6, 1932. He came to Westmoor High in 1958 at the ripe old age of 26. I met him the following year when he was my Physics teacher.

He was an amazing educator who delighted in sparking a love of science in his students. Judy Johnson and Rich Burnham (both from the Class of 1959) said that he was not only a good academic teacher, but he cared

about his students.

He was a serious teacher, but a teacher with a wonderful sense of humor. I remember one test problem on hydraulics. He filled three-quarters of a page with handwritten words describing this intricate problem whose last sentence ended with the words, "... in order to lift a 10,000 lb. canary".

He didn't just teach science in his science classes. I remember another test. There was a problem in which he described a mechanical environment and ended it with the three choices for your answer:

- (A) affects the result
- (B) effects the result
- (C) neither of the above

Was he teaching us Physics or was he teaching us English grammar. Apparently he was teaching both!

I don't think there was a student at Westmoor who knew this man who didn't truly love him. When the Class of 1960 had its Senior Picnic at Fairfax Town and Country Club, we were thrilled that he was going to be one of the chaperones. At that picnic, I did something that hurt this man I loved, and it wasn't until 45 years later that I finally had the opportunity to apologize to him.

At the picnic, I organized a group of fellows to "honor" David by throwing him into the swimming pool fully clothed. Our moment came when he was standing by the edge of the pool. Several of us circled around him. He quickly realized what was about to happen and with a smile he said, "No, fellows, don't do that." Of course, to our juvenile minds that was equivalent to his begging us to go ahead and throw him into the pool. And that's exactly what we did. As we were sailing through the air with him in our grasp, he yelled out a blood-curling scream, "George!!!" Into the water we all went. We quickly rose to the surface and were laughing heartily. Then we noticed that David was at the bottom of the pool, not moving. We quickly dove down and pulled him up and to the side. Thankfully, he was OK physically. But emotionally, we had injured him greatly. We came to learn that not only did he not know how to swim, but he also had an enormous fear of the water.

So instead of "honoring" this man whom we loved, we embarrassed him greatly and hurt him very deeply.

I didn't have the maturity to apologize to him.

Years later, when the Internet became a reality, every so often I would try to find him. But I couldn't. Then, in 2005, someone gave me the idea to contact the Jefferson Union High School District Office to see if they had an address for him. They did. But it was from 1961!! I sent the letter to the District office for them to forward to the address that they had from 40+ years earlier. They sent it off.

Five months after doing that, I got a handwritten response from David. He told me that he was suffering from Parkinson's disease (which was quite evident in his handwriting). He gave me his address (which was a little over an hour's drive from me) and he gave me his phone number. I was so excited that I called him immediately. We hadn't seen one another in over 45 years, but I just said, "Can I come over right now and see you?" He said I should come.

Our visit was wonderful. I couldn't believe how much David remembered of me, of my girl friend, Eva Schulz (Class of 1960), and of the year that he was my Physics teacher. He told me of his wife, Rose Marie, how wonderful she was and how grateful he was for her care of him.

And then I had my chance to bring up the incident at Fairfax Town and Country Club back in 1960. He remembered it very well. As I was telling him about what we had done to him and how bad I felt about it, I came to the part in which he had screamed out "George!!" As I was saying those words, I saw that David was sitting with his head down, the Parkinson's affecting his ability to hold his hands still. When I mentioned the name, "George", David, with his head still down and his arms flailing in front of him, said in a choking voice, "He was my best friend."

Our visit was an emotional one, for both him and me, as we discussed the times at Westmoor and the years since.

I visited David several times after that, one time going with Rich Burnham and Judy Johnson (again, both from the Class of 1959), and David amazed the three of us by what he remembered of that first year of his teaching at Westmoor and of both Rich and Judy, in particular.

On another visit, I brought my wife, Jane, and introduced the two of them. By then, the effects of the Parkinson's were taking a greater toll on his coordination and his ability to speak comfortably.

My last visit with him left me very saddened – this dynamic, highly energetic man was rapidly nearing the end of his days.

He died on April 26, 2009, at the age of 76.

I wish I had known him throughout all those years after Westmoor.

In Memory of Our Teacher

Tony Giammona

July 27, 2005



Former Daly City Mayor Anthony "Tony" Giammona, who served more than 28 years on the city council and was a longtime, inspirational high school basketball coach and player who could regularly sink a two-handed set shot from 25 feet out, has died.

Mr. Giammona, 78, died July 22 in a Sonoma convalescent home after suffering with Alzheimer's disease for seven years.

He was elected six times to the council and served from 1966 to 1992, believed to be the longest council service in Daly City history. He served four one-year terms as mayor.

In the 1960s, Mr. Giammona was active in the effort to enlarge the plans for the Daly City BART station, which was originally envisioned as a smaller facility.

"On the council, he was very diplomatic and professional," recalled his son, Tom. "He believed in the people of Daly City, and he listened to all of them. The meetings would run very late because he always heard everyone out."

Mr. Giammona, a native of Grand Rapids, Mich., was an all-state athletic star at Michigan State University, lettering three times each in football, basketball and baseball. As quarterback on the football team, he is remembered for scoring six touchdowns six different ways in a single game in 1945 -- by passing, receiving, running and by running back an interception, a punt and a kick-off.

He was a World War II veteran of the U.S. Army. In 1951, he became a teacher and coach at Jefferson High School in Daly City. Six years later, when Westmoor High School opened, he was named its first athletic director and selected the school's colors. He chose green and white, after those of Michigan State. He retired from Westmoor in 1983.

As basketball coach, Mr. Giammona favored a tricky passing play -- Number 6 -- that befuddled the opposition. Generations of players recall his nasal voice booming from the sidelines, "Run 6 for a layup!"

His varsity teams at Westmoor won 10 championships in the old North Peninsula League and his lightweight teams won 13 championships. In the late 1970s, his varsity teams won 49 straight games over a four-year span.

Mr. Giammona ended his basketball coaching career with a record of 217 wins and 46 losses.

In the 1960s, he served for five years on the city's recreation commission before being appointed to fill a vacant city council seat. Thirty years later, the commission and the council named the swimming pool at Westmoor High in his honor.

He enjoyed spending entire summers traveling throughout the U.S. in a trailer with his wife and three children, and he visited all 50 states. He continued to play pickup basketball games into his 70s, and his old-fashioned two-handed set shot was as effective as ever.

"He was deadly from 25 feet on in," recalled Tom Giammona. "He never took any money betting on his shot, but he did win an awful lot of Cokes."

Surviving are his children, Tom Giammona of Millbrae, Tony Giammona of Sonoma, and Ginger Casillas of Seattle. His wife of 51 years, Ruth, died in 1998.

Plans for a private memorial service are pending.

Born on July 2, 1926 in Monroe, WI, and passed away peacefully April 15, 2008 after a long battle with prostate cancer. 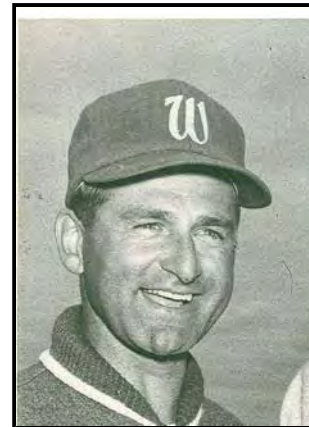

In Memory of Our Teacher

Ernest Ribera

September 25, 2007



Ernest J. Ribera was born in San Francisco on January 7, 1922 to Ernest F. Ribera and Gertrude Pomisel of San Francisco. Ernie started school at Our Lady of Angles School in 1927 and continued on with the Sisters of Mercy at St. Joseph's Academy in Belmont after his mother died from pyelonephritis at Mills Hospital in 1928. He graduated from Washington High School in San Francisco in 1940 and starring in football as quarterback and in track. He attended the original San Mateo Junior College campus. He played football, soccer and track and placed sixth in the mile run in the National Junior College championships in Denver, CO in 1942. He was one of Coach Bud Winter's first track recruits at San Jose State, where he also boxed and developed into a star on the track team. His college career was interrupted by World War II, as he served as a Marine Corps Officer in the Pacific Theater.

Ernie graduated from San Jose State and received his masters degree in education from Stanford. He also served in the Korean War with the Marine Corps. He retired from the USMC Reserves in 1963 with the rank of Lt. Colonel. He started his career in education in 1949 at Jefferson High School where he taught history and coached football and track. Ernie moved on to the new Westmoor High School in 1956 and immediately established Westmoor as a state powerhouse in track and field. He had five 880 yard runners under 2:00 one year, and his best runner, Dave Dunbar won the California State Meet in 1959 with a time of 1:53.

Ernie was vice principal for the new Terra Nova High School from 1960-1962 and opened Oceana High School as its principal in 1962. He was a long time member of the Pacifica Rotary Club and served on the San Mateo County Parks and Recreation Commission. He was called back to Jefferson High School as principal in 1966 and was appointed assistant superintendent of the Jefferson Union High School District in 1968. After 30 years with the Jefferson District, Ernie retired to become the business manager at Sacred Heart Prep in Atherton. He held that position for seven years and concurrently was the driving force in designing and installing the new track and field facility at Sacred Heart. After moving to Solano County in 1987, Ernie coached at the St. Patrick's/St. Vincent's and Benicia High School track teams. In fact, Ernie and the other coaches sent nine hurdlers to the California State meet in nine years. He was also a proud member and Grand Knight of the Knights of Columbus at St. Dominic's in Benicia.

Ernie is survived by Shirley, his wife of over 54 years; sons, Ernest F. (Maria) Ribera, James E. Ribera, William L. (Sherri) Ribera, John J. (Bobbie) Ribera; daughters, Theresa M. Belliardo, Carol Ann (Gary) Nordine, Marilyn J. (Patrick) Cacho and Nancy L. (James) Saraiva and 23 grandchildren. Also survived by his brothers Gilbert, Paul and Anthony Ribera and his sisters Carmen Ribera and Victoria Bruguara.

Vigil services will be held 7:00 p.m., Friday and Mass of Christian Burial will be held 11:30 a.m., Saturday, both at St. Dominic's Church, 475 East I Street, Benicia. 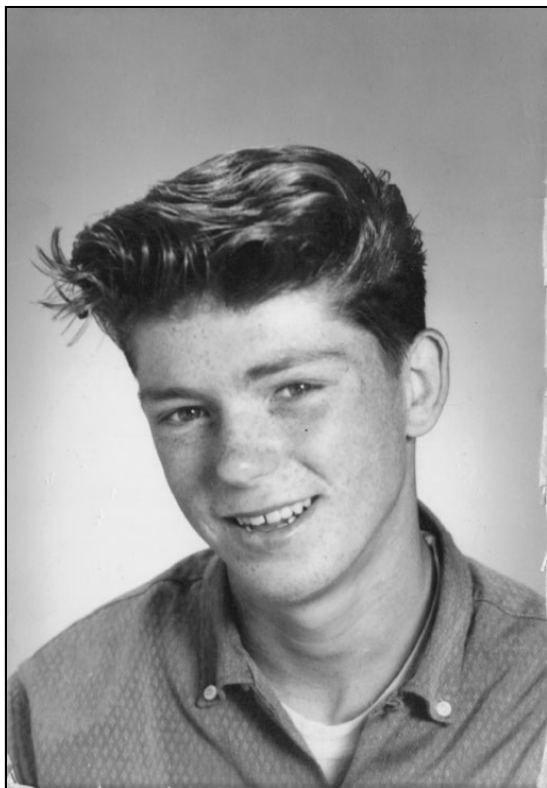
I am currently working on a Coffee Table book on these adventures and prepping a documentary for the Royal Hunt this December.

What would you like to share about what you've been doing since high school?

I left school in 1959 at the beginning of the 12th grade. I've forgotten his name now but I know that it helped me a lot and I wish I could thank him again.

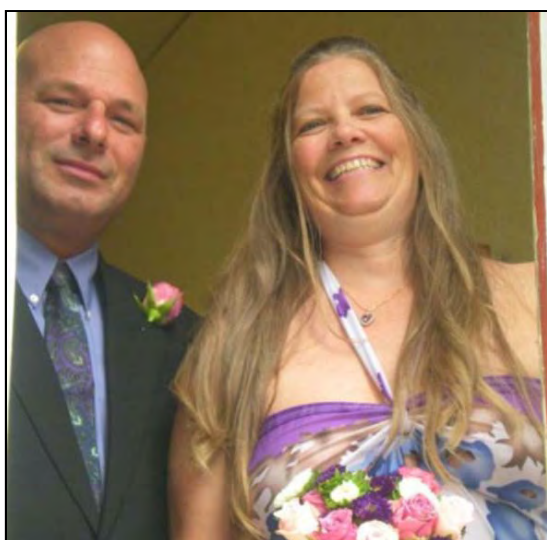

What do you do to occupy your time these days?

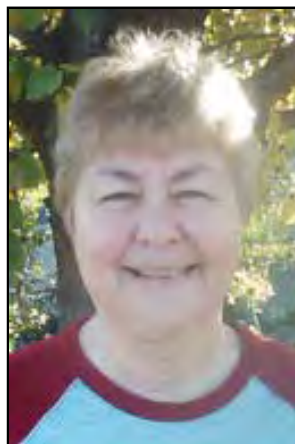

What would you like to share about what you've been doing since high school?

During the summer following graduation, he worked at Fort Scott at the Presidio of San Francisco. After attending one semester at College of San Mateo, he joined the Army. After basic training, he found himself stationed at Fort Scott, one block from where he had worked (join the army and see the world he laughed to himself). After two years at the Presidio, he was transferred to the Military Advisory Group to Laos and became involved in the secret war in Laos. His outfit used the CIA's Air America to drop supplies and ammunition to the forces fighting the communists in Laos. Fortunately, his weapon was a typewriter—he typed the orders, never saw action himself, but because he had a top secret clearance he was knowledgeable about all the intimate details of this secret war (both President Johnson and President Kennedy stated that the US had no military involvement in Laos—again he laughed to himself).

After the service he marked keno tickets in Las Vegas, then moved to Washington DC to attend college at George Washington University while working full-time for the National Rural Elective Cooperative Association. When the GI bill came through, he moved back to California to attend college at Cal-State Long Beach where he earned a BS degree in accounting in 1969. In the meantime, he married and fathered a son, but the marriage didn't last. After graduation he worked for the CPA firm PriceWaterhouse, but found the work boring and lacking excitement.

Like many of the disillusioned, he dropped out in early 1971, traveled the world and

experimented with LSD. He held twelve full-time jobs in the ten years following graduation, not working for three of those years. He traveled to Europe where compliments of his American Express card he rented a Mercedes traveling throughout France and Spain eventually landing on the Island of Ibiza where he spent a great deal of time doing the sex, drugs and rock and roll thing. His world travels led him to taking the chicken buses through Mexico, Guatemala, El Salvador, Honduras and finally Costa Rica where he took a plane to the Island of San Andres, which is part of Columbia. Here he spent thirty days in the Centro de Rehabilitacion (the local prison) for smoking pot on the beach.

In the mid-seventies, he sat in front of the Mormon Tabernacle in West LA, stoned on LSD, where he experienced that he was in fact a businessman. He became a Medicare auditor, worked for several different national hospital chains, went to work for a hospital financial consulting firm and finally started his own business. He married again, but was divorced within a year.

His business grew to the point that after ten years he was able to sell the firm to a group of venture capitalists, although he had to sue them before cashing out with and retiring at 55. In the meantime, he married and fathered a second son, a marriage that recently celebrated twenty-nine years of happy bliss (except for those few times bound to happen where the marital partners are at each other's throat, frustrated by the actions of the other).

After the lawsuit settlement, he went back to college at Santa Rosa JC to play on the golf team where he was the number six man. He liked going to school. It felt good to get away from the business world and learn more meaningful things. He studied music, linguistics, and English. He joined the debate team. He lived a second childhood making friends with students of both sexes younger than his oldest son. In 2002, he moved to Chico to attend Cal-State Chico where he majored in English with an emphasis in creative writing. Over a five year period, he wrote numerous short stories and completed a mystery novel where he metaphorically murdered the venture capitalists that he had to sue to get his money. He still lives in Chico where he writes, plays golf, and spends a great amount of time doing independent studying. He has toned down his wild side and given up alcohol and other harmful ingestibles although he does still smoke the evil weed. He is a spiritually seeking agnostic and explores the possibilities that might exist through Chico's Church of Religious Science and their Spiritual Living Center.

One important consideration is that he has learned over the years that there is a fine line between fiction and nonfiction. To that end, the above might be nothing other than re-invented reality.

What do you do to occupy your time these days?

I write fiction almost every morning, then play golf in the afternoon. I spend a lot of time studying and doing research. Oddly, I was a poor student in high school and in college, but after retiring in 1995 and going back to school at Santa Rosa JC, reading and studying became a major interest, especially as I explored the creative aspects of life and moved as far away as possible from my training in accounting and business.

Favorite memories of Westmoor years:

I attended Westmoor at Jefferson in my freshman year, then went to Ukiah High, Fortuna High, and South Bakersfield High during my sophomore year. My dad built freeways so we moved a lot. I left home at 17 while a junior at South Bakerfield High coming back to Westmoor High for the last half of the spring semester and for my senior year. I was basically on my own living on \$100 a month my folks sent me and a large amount of rice that I had been given from a freeway accident. Oddly, I saw no reason for cutting class so although I could have since I was not under my parents control, I never missed a day of school. I was madly in love with a sophomore, Bonnie Hardy, but after I joined the army in the spring of 1961 I realized I was too young to continue with the relationship. Of course, I was also madly in love with many of the senior and junior girls at Westmoor, but too dumb and scared of women to act out on my desires. I especially thought that Laurel Klaisner and Pat Hunter stood out as not only physically attractive, but highly intelligent. Then there were

the far away beauties such as Pat Cully that seemed totally out of reach, but I'll neve forget the intelligence she often showed in our civics class where I remained completely mute. Then there was Dorothy Boreni who I had a crush on in eighth grade. It was arranged for me to meet her at the last dance in eighth grade, but as I walked up towards her to dance, I saw that she had turned from a girl to a beautiful woman overnight. After a few seconds of dancing, she asked what's wrong and I said that I didn't feel well and turned around and fled--that was the only convesation I ever had with her, but I always kept her in my heart and was sad to see she had passed way several years ago. I wrote a short story called "If It's Foggy Anywhere, It's Foggy in Pacifica" about my encounter with Dorothy at that last eighth grade dance.

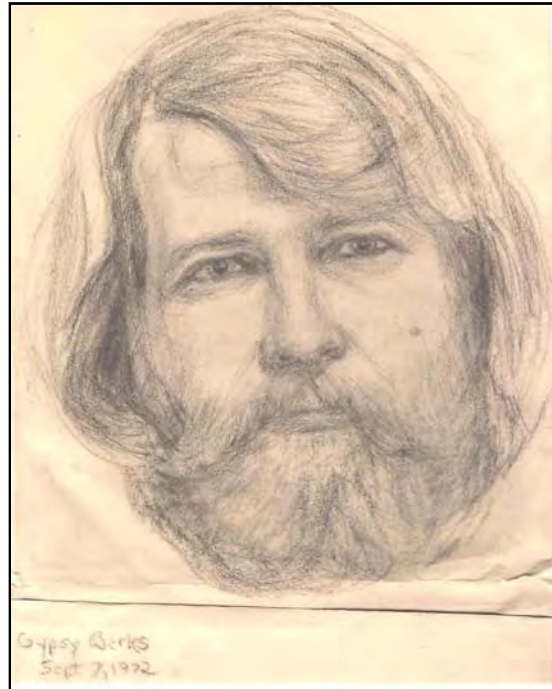

What would you like to share about what you've been doing since high school?

We are just finishing our second building, built by the family, which will give us 1300 sq. ft. of living space and 6000 sq. ft. of shop space. The cars and agriculture take up the most of our space and time. I do find time to fish at Shelter Cove, which is only 9 miles from home, as you will see from my picture.

What would you like to share about what you've been doing since high school?

Life has been good to me and provided me with more than enough challenges and opportunities for learning. At the end of my "time" at SFState where I majored in International Relations and International Economics, I was recruited by a US government Agency to work with Brazilians in Brasil (I'd been working with them on a USAID project during most of my time at SFState.) What would you like to share about what you've been doing since high school?

Jane and I were married the day after I graduated from UC Berkeley with a BA in Math and an MA in Statistics. That was June 1964. A couple of years later, Jane had her BA in German and a teaching credential, and we were set.

My first work experience "post-UC" was at Shell Development, the R&D section of the Shell Oil Company. That is where I got excited about an applied math area totally new to me, "Operations Research". In 1966, I went back to UC to get a PhD in that field, and in 1969, I received the degree.

What would you like to share about what you've been doing since high school?

I remember Frau Heinze trying to teach us HAUTE German. It worked with Len, Ron and some of the other students. Not so much with me.

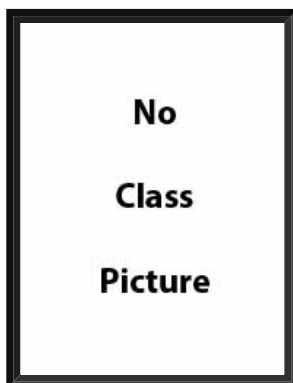
I remember wonderful English teachers who shared so much of their love of our language.

What would you like to share about what you've been doing since high school?

I keep myself busy and happy with work, family and hobbies!

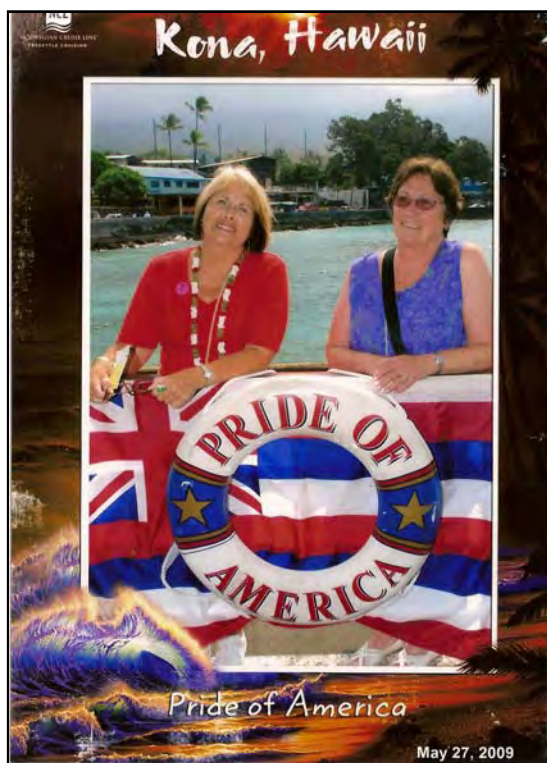
What do you do to occupy your time these days?

During the next ten years I would like to keep getting healthier and stronger and to, of course, lose weight.

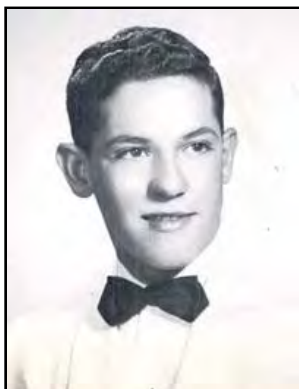

I smoked my first and last cigarette on the corner near school during lunch. I played the flute which requires lots of breath, so needless to say, I was really sick during class.

The play we performed "Night Must Fall" (not a very good choice for high school drama) was performed in the "round", so the audience was onstage as well as in the traditional seating.

Think high school students within feet of the actors. Not a pretty picture.

I said yes, and he threw the whole deck of cards in the air and laughed. Of course, I didn't ask him, and I am still embarrassed and hurt to this day.

Beach Parties at Thorton Beach. Trying to run as fast as Len Jacobson, Pat Russo, Carlos Rivas. Just being on the track team.

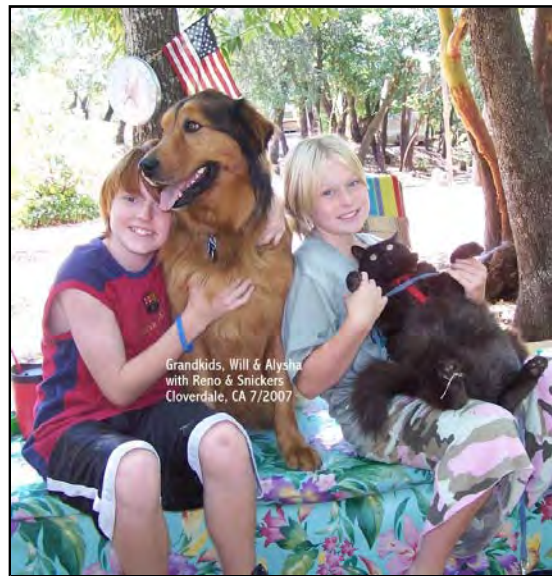

We had machines in many of the shopping malls, drug stores, music stores, schools and they sold for \$1.00 ea (4 quarters into the machine). It was taking off around the world with countries wanting to purchase the rights (Phillips of Holland-owners of Mercury Records) for one, when I became ill, hospitalized for sometime and upon recovery learned the entire corporation had been shut down by our attorneys because our financial backers became "greedy", the West Coast backers against the East Coast backers and they started fighting amongst themselves. Our claim to fame is that we were featured on the front page of Billboard magazine with a wonderful write-up and endorsement. Wurlitzer designed a juke box for our tapes availing it at their Las Vegas show and Merv Griffin recognized us, plus we were instrumental in ABC Records deciding to release "LeRoy Brown" by Jim Croce. We were on our way!

I learned more about business then I would have learned in "4 years of college".

I will never regret pursuing a dream to its fullest and was so good to learn what you can do if you try hard enough.

After that experience and facing divorce, I received my California Real Estate license and then moved to Oregon where I became a Real Estate Broker and loved selling real estate. I renewed my Calif license every year so that I was able to work in both states which helped when selling and trading commercial real estate and ranches.

While living in Oregon and raising my two children, I became involved with horse racing and owned two horses which raced in Washington, Oregon, Calif and Arizona. I consider myself a winner as I broke even when they were sold, so it did not cost me to have all that fun. My children loved helping with the horses and the jockeys and trainers were always teaching them something new and were so kind to them.

In 1979 while living in Oregon I met my husband "Gene McMenamy". We were married on July 26, 1980 in Carmel, Calif. My son was the best man and my daughter was my Matron of Honor. We moved to Fresno, Cal where my husband wrote computer programs for various cities and businesses. Carmel holds a special place in our family--lots of history together there.

We went dancing at least twice a week and the whole family enjoyed playing golf together. It was my daughter and myself-against my son and husband, what fun we all had! Played up and down the state and many times went to the Carmel area for the weekend to play, plus as I had started a ceramic business while in Fresno, we would travel to Monterey, Carmel to restock the stores and collect the sales. I had stores in Montgomery Village, Rohnert Park which carried my ceramics not knowing that this would be where I would end up living. If I had only known!

Once every few years we would drive to Westmoor High School and all around the old haunts, it was wonderful until the last time I just couldn't believe my eye's! What had they done to our school?? I haven't had the heart to drive by again.

My proudest accomplishment is my two children. They never gave me a serious problem growing up, they were totally responsible human beings.

I am proud of what they have accomplished in their lives and proud of the good parents they have become. While they were growing up we had such fun together, going to Little League games -I was the team mother and always furnished refreshments for the team and one time while putting the food out after the game the boys wanted the Bubble Gum which we could not find, we turned around and witnessed my daughter DeAnne's cheek's bulging out--she was stuffing it all

in her mouth!! Brett played baseball for years and loved (still does) the sport.

DeAnne was into Track & Field and did quite well, considered trying out for the Olympics but then she discovered Boys! They both excelled in school and enjoyed attending classes.

My greatest lesson learned is when my husband lost his two legs. His attitude was to help us all adjust, care about our feelings and to go on with his life

as best he good. Life changed for all us after that--but today he works at the Windsor Golf Course as their first wheelchair "starter". I am so proud of him. The lessons he taught me helped me to cope with a stroke last year, I lost my eye sight in one eye, use of my right arm among other things. After Cartoid surgery in my neck, I have regained my sight and use of my arm.

The only problem I experience is loss of memory and delayed memory. I am truly grateful to him for the lessons he taught my children and myself. My children are now very consious of the handicapped and anyone who might need assistance. I must confess that I am getting "tired of learning" and would just like to spend my remaining time with my family, romp among animals and experience the nights under the stars, along with the fresh morning dew in Africa spending my days with the elephants!!

A little over a year ago, I had my DNA done through National Geographic to see where I originated--and it was Tanzania, Africa. Now I know why I felt immediately at home when I arrived on the runway.

Now we know what I would do if I won the lottery!!

What do you do to occupy your time these days?

Time flies so fast and I have so much I want to do. Upon moving to Sonoma County (26 years ago), I went into the Travel business as first a travel agent, then owning my own Travel Office and now still working as a Travel Agent from my home for a well known Travel Agency in Santa Rosa, Ca. My husband and I love to travel whenever we can. He enjoys seeing the United States and loves to cruise. I have traveled to all but four of the States and have spent time in Germany, France, England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales, Australia, New Zealand, Fiji, Jamacia, Africa, Zansibar, Dubai, Grand Caymans, Mexico and Canada. But my very favorite place is Africa, spent 3 weeks on Safari two years ago and hope to go back soon. I would love to live there--if I could, I would retire there. Currently we have a "Sheltie" (Shetland Sheepdog) who is 1 1/2 years old and her name is "Serena". This is my 4th Sheltie and now my husband is as big a fan of this breed, if not bigger than I am. She is the love of his life, he picked her from a picture and had her flown to California from Illinois when she was just under 5 months old.

We so love the visit's with the grandchildren but it's never enough!
We have all taken a few trips together and those were the best trips of all!
We visit our daughter in Redding and try to go back to New York to visit our son when we can.

Our youngest is Kirsten Nicole. She graduated from the Univ. of California-Davis and she wants to earn a master's in earth sciences.

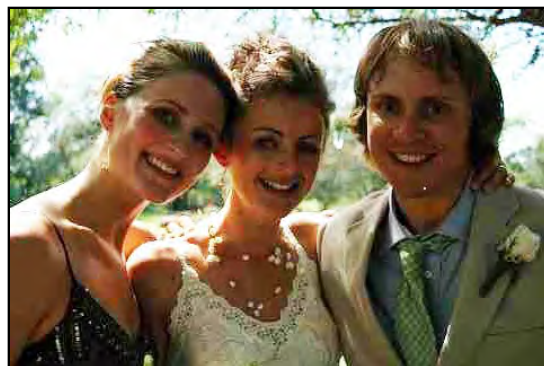

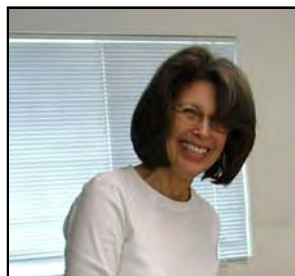

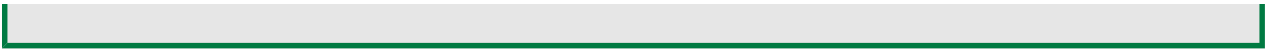

Following a 2 1/2 year stay at Keuka College in NY I began my 1st grown up job as a technical writer and illustrator at Pratt & Whitney Aircraft (United Technologies in E. Hartford, CT) working on the Lunar Excursion Module (LEM) Project, where the fuel cells that propelled the vehicle over the moon's surface were developed. Eight years later decided this was not what I wanted to do for the rest of my life so left and found a job with the State of Connecticut. Unfortunately there was a state hiring freeze on so didn't have a start date. While waiting for the freeze to end, I drove a catering truck from 5am to 2pm daily. memorable and rewarding assignment was the one that brought the opportunity to open a new facility. I had oversight responsibility through construction (got to wear a hard hat even), policy setting, hiring, staff training and reception of the inmate population. All goals accomplished, benefits and pension safely in hand and "still a youngster" in June of 1995, I retired. 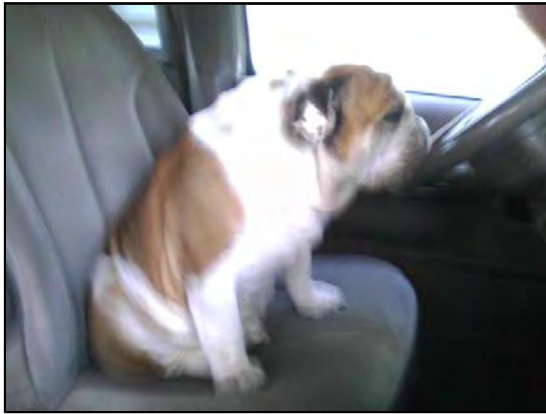
What do you do to occupy your time these days?

What do you do to occupy your time these days?

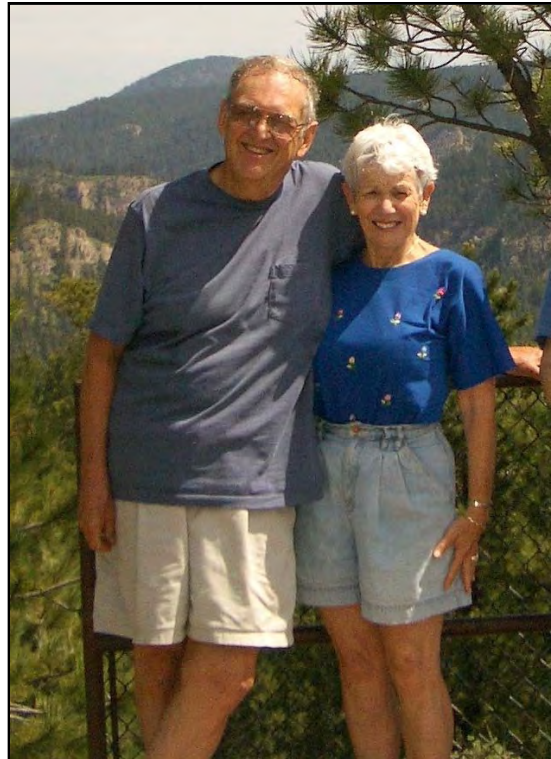

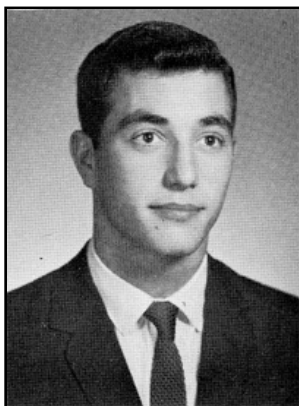
What do you do to occupy your time these days?

What would you like to share about what you've been doing since high school?

Being something of a determinist I have always felt that our social and physical environments shape our life choices. Robert Goodwin, a key figure in the Goleta water wars and a leader in the homeowner activist movement of the 1970s, is dead.

Goodwin, who died this week in Livermore, served as attorney for the Goleta Water District after a slate of young Goletans unseated board members they accused of bringing the fast-growing community to the brink of a water crisis. The newly elected board then imposed a moratorium of new hookups on grounds that supplies were insufficient to serve added demands unless voters approved new sources.

The water board election, paired with Goleta homeowner attorney Jim Slater being elected to the then-pro-growth county Board of Supervisors, sparked an electrifying ferment among young families that had swelled the Goleta population. A group of well-educated Goletans rose up against what they felt was out-of-control growth, lack of proper planning, and a water district policy of officially promising to serve new

developments despite a looming water deficit.

But tumultuous political tides led to fierce disputes as the homeowners won and lost their water board majorities and pro-growth factions regained power. Goodwin, a water law specialist, was ousted as board attorney.

He moved to Livermore around 20 years ago and continued in private practice. A memorial service is planned in Livermore on Friday, August 17, at 11 a.m.

Goodwin graduated from the University of San Francisco in 1964 and its school of law in 1967. He has served as president of the Livermore Chamber of Commerce, president of the ValleyCare Hospital Foundation, director of the Livermore Rotary Club, director of the Eastern Alameda County Bar Association, and Tri-Valley Estate Planning Council.

What would you like to share about what you've been doing since high school?

What would you like to share about what you've been doing since high school?

What would you like to share about what you've been doing since high school?

Since our great old school days, I have had two children, one girl and one boy. My son died in 1987 at the age of twenty. My daughter gave me 3 grandchildren, two girls and one boy. I am on marriage number 3 and what they say about third time is the charm is so correct, for me anyway. Tim and I have been together 29 years and he is without a doubt, my best friend. I recently retired from the work force in January. Forty-nine years was enough. My background is accounting and for the last nine years I worked for a non-profit alcohol and drug treatment center as a business manager.

In 1993 my husband Tim broke his neck in an accident and became a quadriplegic, we moved out to the Black Hills of South Dakota. We have a small 40-acre ranch with horses, donkeys, dogs, cats, and various critters of the wild. It's beautiful wide-open country. The skies are un-encumbered with man's developments. The sunsets are awesome and the night sky is illuminated with stars. With all this solitude I bless the day I got the Internet! I'm not a complete hick...yet.

When Tim had returned from the hospital in California, after his accident, we had to sell everything and start all over. One of the things we sold was our mini motor home. Tim and I would go off on a three-week vacation each year, pick a state and map our route so that we

traveled as many states possible. It was a real pleasure to travel the back roads of America. I've traveled to the Caribbean, Hawaii and Canada. But, sadly Tim said "we can't go camping anymore Hon, we need to sell her". That's when I knew what I had to do. Why not open a handicap accessible campground for families that had wheelchair bound members. I was now on a mission!

I knew that we had to reduce the cost of living. So I went to the library and started my search. I developed a prerequisite of must haves, there were only 5. Number 1. Reduction in the cost of living. 2. Good medical. 3. A natural draw for visitors. 4. Low crime rate. and 5. Natural disaster handling.

You see Tim was ex Navy submariner, yet the VA in California would not give him medical coverage. The rep from the VA said that he had burial coverage only. I quickly retorted, "Thanks, but he's not ready yet!". Anyway, his law enforcement job was a lump sum retirement. So, our path was set.

One day after several days of research I said, "Hey Hon, how would you like to live in Fall River County, South Dakota?" He smiled and asked how I came to that decision. I explained that; 1. South Dakota had a sixty-five percent reduction in the cost of living. 2. It hosts one of the largest VA hospitals and they proclaimed that they were the "Home of the Veterans" and assured us that full medical would be given free of charge. 3. 56 miles away was the infamous Mount Rushmore to the north and 12 miles to Wild Horse Sanctuary and Oglala Sioux Reservation to the South. 4. Major crime is drunken assaults and DUIs. 5. Increment weather was the natural disasters but Fall River County was the "banana belt" of the state. I told my Dad, (who has since passed away) on the phone one day, "Hey Pa, I could have lived in the 1800's!" He quickly retorted, "No you couldn't have." "But why?" I asked. He said, "Cause they didn't make duct tape and WD-40!!"

I have hauled water for an old washer I traded for, bathed my husband in a horse trough, split wood, boiled snow for water, killed rattlesnakes, Sherry 8 -rattlesnakes 0 (the pesty creatures), did bookkeeping for trade and had cooked on a hot plate for 5 years prior to getting a stove. Ah, the fun times.

I had to close the ranch after 8 years because working a full time job, running the campground and caring for Tim was beginning to show on this old gal, besides, I had to undergo knee and shoulder surgery. The doc said that they were considered "football injuries". I told him that I never played football but he insisted that I have my torn meniscus, rotator cuff and scapula tendon repaired.

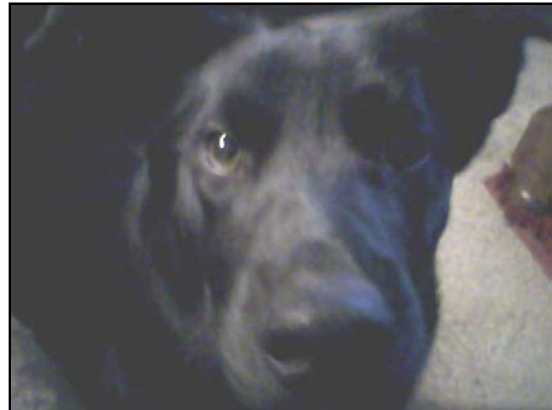
We now have a nice comfortable home and have settled in nicely. We sit on our porch to have morning coffee and watch the evening sunset from our deck.

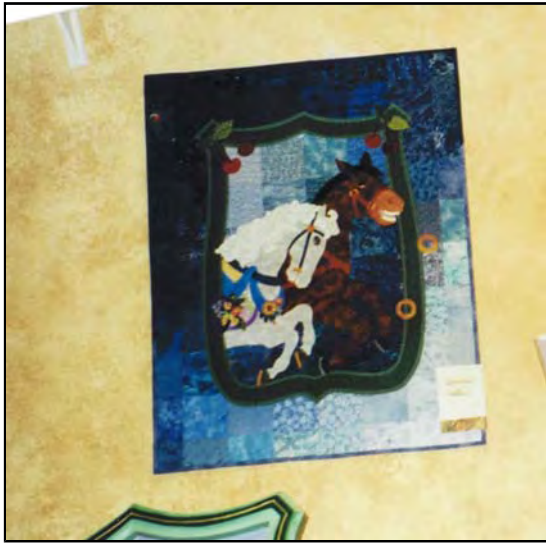

It's June 27, 2010, which marks my sixty sixth year on life's clock here in San Miguel de Allende, and the discovery a year ago today that a tumor might have killed me. Rushed back to San Francisco for medical intervention and a multiple weeks post surgical wait, revealed my lucky stars had been working overtime to spare me from the jaws of suffering. The cantelope sized malignancy on my ovary was encapsulated and had not spread. Surgery was enough treatment for the resurrection of good health. And so, in a sense at this writing, I'm resetting life's clock to register my now being exactly one year new. A semi-ancient, inspired, rebirthed self!

Reflecting thru the chapters of the Book Of Me, I re-remember a journey of colors and

shapes - a blur of adventures and kaleidoscopic changes. Early marriage in Marin at just twenty one to a Londoner - seeking the envelope of shared experience which my parents so lovingly enjoyed for a lifetime, lasted six years for me. Unfulfilling fit. So rare to have the foresight to choose thus importantly when so young and as yet undeveloped. Returned to finish degree at University of San Francisco, working two jobs to fuel graduate school in San Diego. An internship at Jewish Family Services in San Francisco completed licensure as a Marriage and Family Therapist. Then at thirty one marriage #2 to a Stanford mathematician found us in his homeland of So. Africa where we considered medical school. With Mandela's imprisonment and the barometer of injustices beyond bearing, we returned to the S.F. Bay avoiding what would have been the inevitable imprisonment for apartheid civil disobedience. Our journey together brought us to Los Angeles for the next decade of wearing turbaned whites, going veg., meditating-chanting-doing yoga and playing music daily. Being part of a spiritually seeking community became the foundation of our lives. And into this oasis of conscious pilgrimages our now thirty two year old son Simran was born. Happily for us he has always lived nearby.

Now it's twenty two years later and I look back on a thirty five year career as a Ph.D. level psychologist, having primarily specialized in serving people with cancer and AIDS. My son's father suffered a disabling brain disorder for many years, resulting in our divorce after twenty two years of marriage. We have continued to remain kindred dear hearts, living close by to one another in Marin. At present he's battling an advanced pancreatic cancer - the same disease which took the life of my older brother Ron Goldman, just three weeks after he was diagnosed at age sixty four. Interesting how the skills and insights developed along my own life's journey have served my family and others so fruitfully along the way. How many of you classmates remember the handsome young artist amongst us - David Mark? After so many years of disconnect we bumped into one another along the journeyed path, and shared so meaningfully that last stretch of time before the AIDS virus claimed his life. He was a self styled creative Pilgrim from early on - and a touchstone muse for me as well.

Most recently I've discovered art as my own passion. No longer just looking and enjoying, but now creating too. Who would have guessed that collage, painting and assemblage would get me into museum and gallery shows - earning several awards as a late in life "newbie"! Buying a lovely home in an artists' enclave in Mexico and shuttling between here and Novato, I continue to maintain my primary home, a part time counseling practice, singing in a rock n'roll choir in Sonoma, skiing, daily workouts, knitting, growing tomatoes, doing yoga, communing with my little terrier Lulu, and pondering the meanings of the Universe - I enjoy a technicolor life with family and friends, and I can truly say. . . my cup runneth over!! 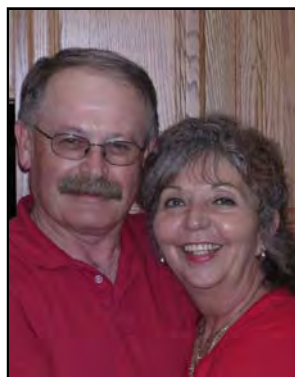

What would you like to share about what you've been doing since high school?

After I graduated from Westmoor, I went to UC - Berkeley. I was in the School of Optometry my junior and senior years, but I left in the middle of my senior year because I couldn't envision myself spending a career asking patients, "Which is better, 1 or 2?" or the equally popular "Which is better, red or green?" At that time the program was three years (now it's four), so I would have had another year and a half to complete it.

So I became a court reporter, going to a school in San Francisco. I knew about the profession because my dad was a court reporter in Superior Court in San Francisco. I spent two years in Superior Court in Redwood City and 35 years as a deposition reporter. I recall a rape case that I reported in 1968 that involved a defendant who raped two girls at the same time (which sounds impossible, but I mean practically the same time). This was a jury trial. In chambers during the trial the judge said to the defendant (later found guilty) and his attorney, "The screwin' you've been doin' ain't like the screwin' you're gonna get."

I've taken depositions in London, Tokyo, Genoa, Milpitas, etc. The great majority of my work was in San Francisco. After X millions of words, I didn't want to write any more of them, so at the end of April 2003 I retired.

What do you do to occupy your time these days?

Now that I'm retired, I read, travel some, and am on the computer a fair amount of time. I have friends and relatives in Wyoming (where I was born) and Colorado. I usually go there in the summer. In 1989 I went to Israel and Egypt with ten other people from my church. I also have good friends in England and Denmark. I've been to both countries quite a few times, though not recently. I have a small library that consists of a pretty decent representation of the whole Western canon.

I'll be starting my fourth year of tutoring 5th graders in an after-school program in San Mateo for kids whose parents aren't very adept in English. These are kids who have fallen behind because their parents can't help them with their homework because the parents can't read the English texts, typically. I've discovered that I'm smarter than a 5th grader. A few years ago I told my little group of guys that I would give a dollar to anyone who could spell Albuquerque. No one ever got it right (probably because I was too cheap), but one of the bolder attempts was "Alvakerkia." I think that most adults who don't live in New Mexico can't spell it either. If they finish their homework and we have enough time, I teach them to play chess. They love the game and usually buckle down so they can get done and do something they like better than homework.

In the '80s I was a volunteer at Hillcrest Juvenile Hall in Belmont. I hoped to be an alternative to television or ping pong and just be someone from the outside they could use as a sounding board. I taught both boys and girls to play chess. Some of them already knew how to play the game. I did this for about four and a half years. I discovered that the best chess players at Hillcrest were the burglars.

In 2008 I was part of a Kairos team that went into San Quentin to interact with prisoners. Kairos is a Christian endeavor. The team met for six consecutive Saturdays to prepare for going in. Our team was about 30 guys in number. A very important part of the team were six women who prepared breakfast and dinner for us at a Presbyterian church in San Anselmo, our rendezvous point. We were in San Quentin all day for four consecutive days. As part of a Kairos team you make a commitment to come back once a month for a year. We were all advised that if a member of the team is taken hostage, the authorities at San Quentin will not negotiate for your release. My mom was worried about my going in when I told her about this protocol. I told her, "Don't worry, mom, they have a No Hostage policy."

I have been an active member of the First Presbyterian Church of Burlingame since 1984. For about 13 years I was a Stephen Minister. We are simply lay ministers. In a larger congregation the pastors can't necessarily handle all of the problems that inevitably arise with people, so Stephen Ministers help relieve the pressure on the pastors. We are not there to solve people's problems but simply to walk alongside them during a crisis or a problem of some sort. I was also a deacon for six years but am no longer.

I still follow pretty avidly what's happening in chess. I replay the games of the best grandmasters in the world.

Favorite memories of Westmoor years:

One of the things I liked best about my three years at Westmoor was the kinds of classes offered. I also thought the teachers were of very high calibre. A highly motivating factor for my getting out of bed and going to school was the unusually large number of beautiful girls in the 1961 class.

I used to go to wrestling matches for a bit of a macabre reason: I liked to see the look on the faces of the opponents of Bob Villines when they got their first glimpse of Bob and realized that they were about to have to wrestle the largest human being they likely had ever seen. I think Bob was about 6' 11," but a couple of guys at the reunion told me they thought he was 6' 9." Fortunately, Bob had a very mellow disposition. He was in my German class, and I can recall that he had to duck when he came through the classroom door. One

time I saw a couple of the coaches try to weigh Bob. He crunched the scale. They didn't know how much he weighed.

I recall Jim Skinner, who I thought had a certain comedic genius. I think that if he had lived, he might very well have gone on to stardom as an entertainer. He was already a very talented comic as a teenager.

When we were Seniors, Jim Gray and I started a chess club. I think this must have been the first chess club at Westmoor. Jim was one of my best friends, and we were roommates our first semester at UC - Berkeley. When he came up missing at sea in January 2007, I twice went down to City Yachts, where he kept his sailboat, and asked the harbor master for any news. He said there were a thousand scenarios that could have played out.

I was very saddened to see that a lot of our classmates have passed away, none of them having reached their threescore and ten.

I now Repair, restore and Refinish Antiques and Fine Furniture in my home based shop .. and I love it.

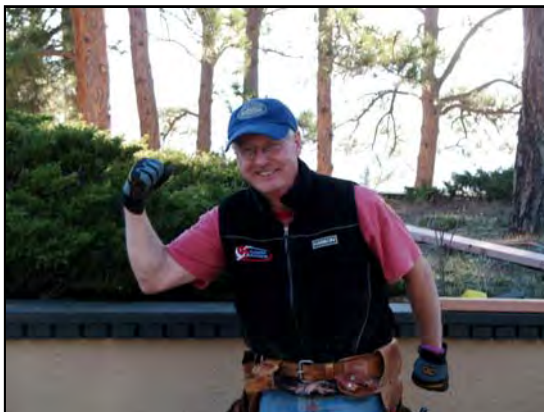
Hobbies: Woodworking is my passion, but I also love to fish, bike, and hike, travel and spend time spoiling a growing number of grandkids.

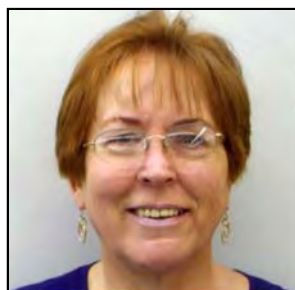

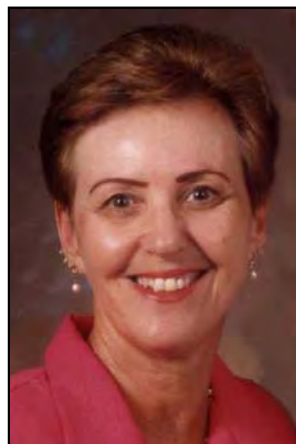

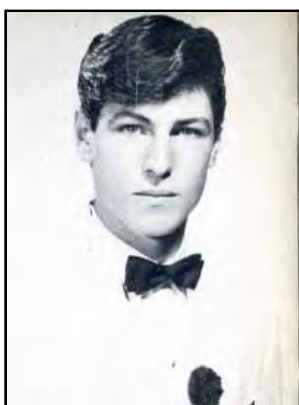

What would you like to share about what you've been doing since high school?

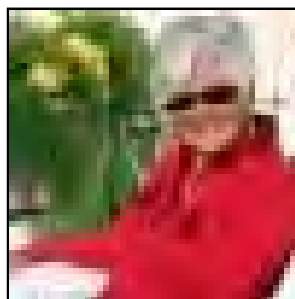
What do you do to occupy your time these days?

What would you like to share about what you've been doing since high school?

I attended San Francisco State with a major in music, but before the year was out my mother divorced and moved us to Sacramento where I worked for the Postal Service for 25 years. I was then diagnosed with FIBROMYALGIA; a disease that erupted as a result of a fall that became so painful that I spent much of my time confined to a scooter or bed. Unable to find a cure for this malady from conventional doctors, I became very interested in therapeutic herbs and high-quality essential oils in the hopes that they would help; but unfortunately they did not. Before Lavender Lane and Juice Plus+ I published many articles and short stories, but I never tried my hand at writing that 'Great American Novel'. So, 6 weeks later my historical novel had amassed over 100,000 words. I'm still tweaking it between my other enterprises. Also, it's been many, many years since I used to dance and I am looking forward to learning to dance once again.

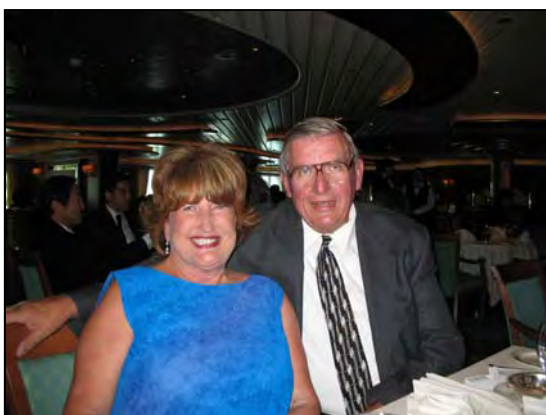

What would you like to share about what you've been doing since high school?

I was a free spirit out of high school and had absolutely no idea what I wanted to do. However, my parents thought differently. My mother's brother and wife lived in Baton Rouge, LA. His wife was a sponsor for a sorority, Delta Gamma, at LSU (Louisiana State University). I, who never took preparatory courses for college ended up BEING in college. What do you do to occupy your time these days?

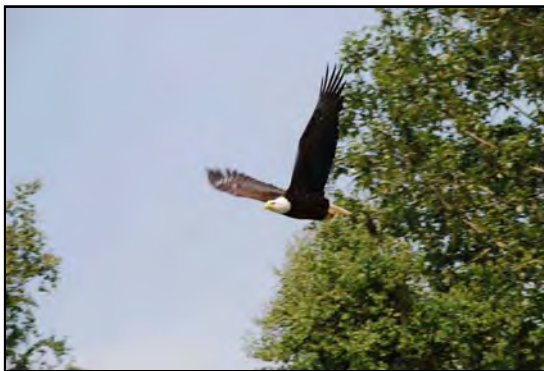

What would you like to share about what you've been doing since high school?

Hard to believe that it has been almost 49 or 50 years, depending on your class. It's been one hell of a ride though. A couple of marriages, a couple of kids. Someone said that life is what happens while you are making other plans. It was about the end of my junior year that I realized that my childhood dream of playing basketball at the University of San Francisco (just a few years behind the great Bill Russell and K.C. Jones) were never going to materialize. That being the case, it also blew away any chance I would have of eventually playing 10 years or so for the Boston Celtics (again, following Russell and Jones). Without that option, I probably wasn't going to get into sports broadcasting after my retirement from the NBA. For any of you that shared classes with me, well, you already knew that I was not an academic all star either. During my senior year I was really running out of options. If I were ever to lose my job at Swanson's Westlake Bowl, most people wouldn't even give me much of a chance of becoming a shift supervisor at Pipp's Drive-In. Living on my own those last couple of years didn't exactly help my situation either. Immediately after graduation it became apparent that the military was my only option. How bad could it be? Monthly paycheck, three hots and a cot every day, free clothing, a months vacation, free medical. What more could a guy want? So, after a few months at Fort Ord, Fort Benning and Fort Gordon, it's yes ma'am, here I am, right smack dab in the middle of Viet Nam. But when I enlisted they promised to send me to Europe! They did, eventually, for my last 16

months. That's where I ran into Tom Dake (married to Barbara Kerr at the time). We were stationed in Germany but were in different units, so didn't see much of them. It wasn't long after I got out of the Army that the biggest stroke of Irish luck came my way. I was working as a bartender in Vallejo (and you thought I wasn't going to move up) that I saw an ad for Interstate Electronics at the shipyard at Mare Island. Looked interesting, so I applied. Unfortunately, so did a little over a hundred other people. Interstate was working on Polaris submarines for the Navy and was looking for a combination technical/administrative type person. I wasn't even close to being the most qualified person for the job. I did, however, possess something none of the others candidates had. As part of my military background, I had a TSC (Top Secret Crypto) security clearance. The person who hired me told me that they would give me a chance because it would save the company thousands of dollars doing a background check on me. Since I had been out of the Army less than a year, all they had to do was run an NSA (National Security Agency) check on me for the time I had been out of the Army till the date of hire. This was really my big chance and I told the guy that I wouldn't let him down. As I look back, everything good that happened to me professionally for the rest of my working career started that moment. Interstate Electronics gave me the opportunity to learn new skills and to travel extensively, all at the expense of the company. I worked at Mare Island; Bremerton, Washington; Portsmouth, New Hampshire; Groton, Connecticut; Newport News, Virginia; Charleston, South Carolina; Cape Canaveral, Florida; Guam; Rota, Spain and Holy Loch, Scotland (working on the British Version of Polaris) and finally Marietta, Georgia, working on the C5A aircraft. Working in the aero-space industry at that time, all the secret projects, etc. was about as exciting as it gets. After a couple of years of traveling around in field engineering, I finally worked my way into a sort of fat cat job at the home office in Anaheim. Where I became the right hand man of the Division VP. That was the second luckiest thing that happened in my career. The guy I worked for (L.C. Knox) became my mentor and taught me more about business and people during the time that I worked for him than I've learned the rest of my life in college and business. One of the people in your life that you never forget. One of the things he taught me was that no matter how well I performed for the company, I could only advance so far with them or any place else without a formal education. Thus began my quest for a college degree. The good thing was that at the time I was married with one child. I had the GI bill (tax free money every month) and all I had to do was get passing grades and the company would pay for my tuition and books. I might have just taken up space at Westmoor but I wasn't going to let this opportunity pass me by. At the time, some guys were going bowling three nights a week. Me, I went to school three nights a week. I started out at UC Irving (before they actually had a campus) when they were holding classes in an old high school building, also attended UCLA, Solano College and finally graduating from the University of Minnesota at the age of 33. Not only was I a graduate, but I had over 10 years experience to boot. Going to school was so financially rewarding that I purposely delayed graduating to keep the GI Bill money coming in every month. Unfortunately, after two extensions granted by the VA, they told me to graduate or else because they were going to stop paying me at the end of the current semester. Great while it lasted though. Obviously, at the time I graduated, I wasn't working for Interstate any longer and was living in Minnesota. In 1970, I left Interstate and went to work for a start-up company in Sunnyvale. Most of the employees were ex-Interstate. We had this great idea of using re-manufactured car stereo cassette players as input-output devices for mini computers. At the time they were using paper tape, much like a teletype machine. Well, it might have been a great idea but we were all pretty naïve about start-up ventures, venture capital and all the pitfalls that come along with a new company. Needless to say, after a year or so we were broke and the company was taken over by the money people. When I was relieved of my duties with the company I decided to take advantage of the situation and became a full time student. My wife was a school teacher and with the GI Bill, we were able to pull it off. After two years though at Solano College her contract wasn't funded for the coming year. This was right after I had been accepted to Golden Gate College in the City. Now I had to quickly make another plan because teaching position at that time were at a premium. I was going to have to re-join the workforce. I started to look for jobs all over the country. As it turned out I was contacted by a company in Minneapolis who made computer memories. They were looking for a field engineering manager. The ironic part is that my wife was from St. Paul. I took a final on a Tuesday, flew to Minneapolis that night, interviewed on Wednesday morning, they made me an offer after lunch, returned to California that evening, had another final Thursday morning, and started packing on Friday. My Irish luck was still holding out. I worked for the company (Fabri-Tek) for a couple of years then decided to venture out on my own doing the same thing. With \$42.00, enough to print some business cards, letterhead and envelopes, I started Peripheral Maintenance Associates and took most of my crew from Fabri-Tek with me. After a couple of years, much to my surprise, a company came along and offered to buy me out. At first I didn't want to sell but realized that in the scheme of

things it was a small company (20 employees and three offices) and I would never have the wherewithal to develop the next big thing in computer memories. That being the case, I decided to sell. I'd never seen that much money all at one time anyway. The way I looked at it, if I started the company with more or less pocket change, surely now that I had some real capital I could find or start another venture. I could afford to take my time. It wasn't like I would be depending on next weeks paycheck. I could spend a few hundred more words describing the ventures that I undertook. Some were successful and some were less than great. Had fun with every one of them though. Moved to Colorado and Texas for a few years but finally returned to Minnesota in 1987. I became the Director of Retail Systems for a national hardware distributor for a few years then moved on to become the National Sales Manager for Jasc Software. Another company you probably never heard of but they were a pain in the butt to Adobe. We had a product called Paint Shop Pro which was the poor mans version of PhotoShop. Had a good run with that company. Enough to buy the boat I now call home. After Jasc I had a small software consulting firm for a couple of years and spent the last five years of my working life as the Director of Operations for a wholesale distributor in Minneapolis. This last venture was probably the hardest I had worked in over 40 years but the absolute most fun. The owner and I got along and I could pretty much do anything with the company that I wanted as long as I first convinced him that it was his idea in the first place. I probably would have worked a couple of more years had he not gotten cancer and died and the company sold. That takes me to 2003. Along the way; I was divorced in 2001. Not long after I met my current wife Cheryl. After a couple of dates I told her that I owned a sailboat and that I was planning to retire aboard it and go cruising. After spending a couple of weekends aboard she decided that she would be all over that. We began making plans way back then. After a couple of season of sailing on Lake Superior she became a pretty accomplished sailor in her own right. Now there isn't much aboard that she can't do. Navigate, splice line, cook, work on the diesel engine, you name it, she can do it. It also helps that she is a few years younger than me. Keeps me from getting overworked. As I write this, it is October 2009 and we are currently in the last couple of weeks of preparation to sail south for the winter in the Bahamas. Just a month ago we came back from spending 10 weeks on the Chesapeake Bay. Jim Gray

January 28, 2007



Computer database wizard Jim Gray woke up Jan. 28, 2007, at his home on Telegraph Hill, surveyed the calm, sunny skies, and decided it was the perfect day to scatter his mother's ashes at sea.

Gray, 63, embarked from Gashouse Cove in San Francisco in his 40-foot sailboat, named Tenacious, and headed solo for the Farallon Islands.

He hasn't been seen since.

The mystery surrounding Gray's disappearance has never been solved, but almost 1,000 of his friends and colleagues - including some titans in the technology world - gathered in Berkeley Saturday to keep his memory alive and forge ahead with his research.

"He was a mountain of a person, and our community misses him immeasurably," said Michael Stonebreaker, professor emeritus of computer science at UC Berkeley, at a tribute to Gray held on the Cal

campus Saturday. "He was a giant, interested in everything. He epitomized what it means to be a scholar."

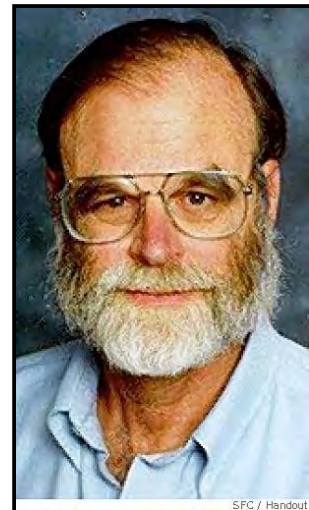
Gray pioneered database technology in the 1970s, and was among the first to develop the technology used in computerized transactions. He discovered ways to ensure transactions, such as moving money from one account to another, would complete even if a computer crashed, and that transactions could happen sequentially, for example allowing a husband and wife to each deposit money into a joint account from separate computers.

His work is now used in nearly all Internet retail sales, by banks and credit card companies and for airline reservations. His later work on database technology has been used by oceanographers, geologists, astronomers and the general public to map the Earth via Google Earth and TerraServer.

"No matter who I asked, everyone always thought Jim Gray was smarter than they were," said David Vaskevitch, a vice president at Microsoft who spoke at Gray's tribute. "That's saying a lot in a field that has a whole lot of smart people."

Gray's greatest contribution was not his research, but his warm, open-hearted personality, his friends said. Gray was a mentor to hundreds of computer scientists and brought together researchers from dozens of competing companies and fields.

"Jimi Hendrix once said that knowledge speaks, but wisdom listens. Jim Gray listened," said Pat Helland, a researcher at Microsoft, where Gray worked for many years. "He always, always listened."



Gray was an experienced sailor and often took his colleagues for spins around San Francisco Bay. On the Sunday he vanished, he made a few calls on his cell phone and checked his e-mail before sailing out of cell phone range, somewhere between the Golden Gate and the Farallons.

When he didn't return that evening, his wife called the U.S. Coast Guard, and his extensive network of friends, who used their technological expertise to comb the waters for their colleague.

"If you're going to go missing, you want to be Jim Gray," said Michael Olson, a former vice president at Oracle who led the volunteer search efforts. "He knew everybody. But the ocean is enormous and unforgiving."

Gray's friends at NASA moved several satellites over the Golden Gate to scan the ocean for signs of his boat. Volunteers scattered along the coast putting up posters and looking for telltale debris. The U.S. Coast Guard searched 132,000 square miles of the Pacific.

But after three weeks, nothing was found. No boat, no wreckage, no sign of Gray. One theory is that a shipping container, floating just below the surface, ripped a hole in the boat's fiberglass hull and the boat sank.

In autumn, Gray's wife, Donna Carnes, and a few of their friends decided to hold a tribute to Gray, careful not to use the words "memorial" or "funeral." After a few speeches on Gray's contributions to technology, the crowd gathered for a six-hour conference advancing his research.

UC Berkeley also announced that Google, Microsoft, Hewlett-Packard, Oracle and other technology giants chipped in to endow a chair in Gray's honor in the computer science department, where Gray received his undergraduate and graduate degrees.

"Everyone's sad about the reason we're here, but it's actually wonderful to see everyone," Olson said. "Jim brought us all together."
