INTERNATIONAL QUILT FESTIVAL, HERE COMES ALWAYS IN STITCHES

We're heading northwest on this year's bus trip, to the International Quilt Festival in Chicago.

Plan now to spend June 21 enjoying the quilt exhibits, shopping opportunities, and a great mix of events. The festival is all-around fun but not just about quilting. Promoters say it will appeal to fans of just about anything creative, including crafts, antiques, scrapbooking and paper arts.

Special show events include Open Studios, where you can watch four fiber artists work, and Make It University, where you can spend an hour with top quilters to learn a new skill while making a whimsical souvenir.



The bus will leave from

Noblesville East Middle School, directly behind the shop, at 6:30 a.m. and return by 9 p.m. Your \$74.95 ticket includes transportation, breakfast snacks, an AIS goodie bag, show admission and fun surprises from the staff. Lunch and dinner are on your own at the show and on the way home.

QUILTERS, THREAD YOUR BOBBINS

Take an early lead on race month at our 1600 Race Day on May 10.

Whether you're a veteran quilter or an experienced beginner, you'll take home a throw-size quilt top made from one jelly roll or 40 2.5-by-40-inch strips. It's not a race if there aren't prizes so we're lining up some wonderful ones.
