Landscape Quilting All Levels



In this class we will make a quilt taken from a photo I took many years ago of Entrance Island just before you head out through the narrows into Prince William Sound. Take the Stan Stephen Glacier Cruise offered the day before classes start and see the sight for yourself. The linear type design is taken from a class with Gloria Loughman but I have changed the technique used to achieve the look. You will learn a new way of raw edge applique that seals the edges of the fabric so they don't fray but does not produce the stiffness of a fusible webbing. The quilt will be quilted as it is assembled.

I will also show you how to take your own photo and turn it into a quilted wallhanging.

You will need a variety of fabrics for this quilt. There are 9 different 'mountain' pieces in the quilt, glaciers, water and sky and each takes two fabrics. When you have signed up for the class I will send you a more detailed description of fabric and some other photos of the quilt in different fabrics. I will have fabrics available at the class. If you want a kit of fabrics I could make that available if you email me at trudykoszarek@gmail.com at least 3 weeks before the Festival.

Other supplies:

Paper and fabric scissors
Sewing machine with walking foot and/or free machine quilting foot
Thread to compliment outer fabrics

Patten and other supplies fee: \$10

I will supply:

Pattern copied onto freezer paper and placement guide

Fusible agent and misc supplies for fusing

Spray basted quilt sandwich for the base of the quilt (22" x 33")
