

### May 26, 2014 Regular Meeting

- Motion carried to approve Payroll 05B 05-25-14 \$12,302.62; Fringe Benefits and Taxes \$9,359.52; 2014 5B Payables \$19,533.00. 5-0
- Jake Bruntz addressed the council during Public Comment regarding the condition of the city park over Memorial Day.
- Motion carried to approve the agenda as amended. 5-0
- Motion carried to authorize the hiring of three security guards for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July from Smart Security, Wichita and the City and 4th Committee would split the cost of this security service.
- Motion carried to adopt Resolution 2014-001; A Resolution adopting a Hazard Mitigation Plan for the City of Peabody. 5-0 This plan was submitted by Randy Frank, IACEM Director, Marion County Emergency Management.
- Motion carried to appoint Krishyn Caldwell as City Treasurer and that she be authorized to be a signatory on city accounts. 5-0
- Motion carried to adopt Ordinance 03-2014; An ordinance amending and adding thereto Chapter XIV, Waterworks; Article 1. General Utilities Regulation and Charges; Section 14-108 Water Rates, Penalties, and Reconnection Fees; and Adding New Section 14-118 Landlord Liability to the Code of the City of Peabody Kansas. 5-0
- Motion carried to table the Fire Cadet Program until the following questions are answered:
  - Do they have permission from USD 398 for students to participate in this program?
  - Has the Marion County 4th Fire District given its support and endorsement of this program?
  - Would the participants be allowed to have access to the Fire Station without having adult leadership present?
- Motion carried to authorize Midwest Mobile Washers to wash the water tower for a price not to exceed \$4,980.00. 5-0

NEW WATER RATES published June 4, 2014 ORDINANCE 03-2014

Section 1. That Chapter XIV, Waterworks, Article 1. General Utilities Regulation and charges, Section 14-108, Water Rates, Penalties, and Reconnection Fees, is hereby amended as follows:

a) The following rates are hereby established for all water customers of the City: 1) except as otherwise provided in subsections (3) and (4) below, all customers receiving within the city limits shall pay a minimum monthly charge of \$30.00 plus \$3.60 per 100 cubic feet of water used or any portion thereof. 2) All customers receiving service outside of the city limits shall pay a minimum monthly charge of \$35.00 plus \$3.85 per 100 cubic feet of water used or any portion thereof. 3) For water used for irrigation purposes only by USD No398 as to Blocks 28and 51 in the City USD 398 shall pay \$3.60 per 100 cubic feet of water used or any portion thereof. 4) For water hauled by individuals from a fire hydrant or well house, such individuals shall pay a minimum charge of \$50.00 plus \$6.00 per 1,000 gallons or any portion thereof. 5) All bills delinquent after the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month of the billing shall be subject to a ten percent (10%) penalty. 6) A water service reconnection of \$50.00 shall be paid prior to reconnecting a utility service disconnected following a delinquency; the customer shall also pay to the City the entire balance due and owing to the City at the time of reconnection.

Section 2. That Chapter XIV, Waterworks, Article 1, General Utilities Regulation and Charges, Section 14-108, Water Rates, Penalties, and Reconnection Fess, is hereby amended by further adding new subsection Section 14-118 LANDLORD LIABILITY to read as follows: Section 14-118 LANDLORD LIABILITY

- a) Owners of premises served by utility service under this ordinance shall be liable for payment of the costs of any utility service account delinquency arising from service provided to such premises, regardless of whether the utility service was furnished upon the application and request of the owner or lessee of the premises. This provision shall also apply when the premises are leased by or through an agent or other representative of the owner.
- b) In the event that a delinquency arises involving leased premises, in addition to the tenant, the owner or owner's agent shall be notified in writing of the delinquency of the lessee within 10 days after the billing to the lessee becomes delinquent. Notice shall be sufficient if mailed to the last known address of the owner or owner's agent known to city personnel responsible for said mailing, after reasonable inquiry.
- c) If utility is furnished to a leased premise on the application or request of the lessor of the premises, then all billings for utilities furnished to such leased premises shall be made directly to the lessor, and the lessor shall be fully liable for the cost of service furnished.
- d) The city may collect the amount of the unpaid bill for utility services by any lawful means. Provided, however, that in no event may the city place a lien on real estate of the lessor.
