- We had a nice time in San Francisco for Bernina University. We went two days early and enjoyed a little sightseeing. Then for the last four days we attended different classes of a variety of topics during Bernina University. Following as a short synopsis of what we learned about new products. More information will follow as the time approaches.
- > The BERNINA 820 and 830 are being replaced with the new BERNINA 880. This machine has some awesome capabilities and will be available later this fall.
- > The BERNINA 450 is being replaced with the new BERNINA 560. The B560 is a midrange sewing and embroidery machine. This machine is being launched sometime around September.
- > The is a new entry level bernette sewing and embroidery machine combination the Chicago 7. The entire bernette line has also been renamed.
- > New Version 7 Embroidery Software will be released and BERNINA is beginning to introduce a new line of serger's.

Feetures Foot Facts

• Applique Foot #23

The Applique Foot #23 is suited for sewing narrow (2mm or smaller) satin stitching for delicate applique designs. This dainty applique stitch is perfect for children's and infant's clothing, and heirloom projects.

The 2mm channel under the front of Foot #23 allows precision placement of narrow satin stitching. While the cut-out underneath the foot is very narrow through the stitching area, it broadens considerably toward the back of the foot, allowing bulky stitching to pass under the foot without building up and inhibiting the feeding of the fabric, even around curves. The clear plastic foot gives an unobstructed view of the needle and the stitching area. In addition, the Foot #23 is much shorter then most presser feet, these two attributes are very useful when stitching around applique shapes, particularly at corners and curves. This foot can be used for satin stitching less then 2mm wide when a clear foot is needed.

Because the 2mm channel under Foot #23 extends to the front of the single toe, it can be used to guide narrow cord—such as gimp or perle cotton - under a satin stitch, producing a raised, prominent line of stitching.
