



Use leftover corners to make a Half-Square-Triangle Block.




Make fast Half-Square Triangles:


Cut two strips, 1/2" wider than finished block. Place strips right sides together.













Trim Half-Square Triangle Blocks to size:


Leftover HST Blocks can be trimmed to size after pressing open, but it is timeconsuming:



Trim 4 open sides


Instead, before pressing, place bottom edge at desired size and align seam line with the FCC line. Trim dog-ear and left edge.





Great for Bindings too!

Right Sides Place one strip on top of the other, matching right edges, with **both**



Align markings of FCC with lower right corner as shown. Trim.



Rotate top piece and place wrong side up on the bottom piece. Sew 1/4" seam and press open.
