Bolster Pillow

Heirloom looks are back in style and seen prominently in children's wear, women's wear and home dec. The techniques are time consuming when done on the sewing machine, but very fast – and quite easily accomplished – on the serger! Try some of the best heirloom serger stitches including pintucks and lace



insertions. Finish the look with a rolled hem edged gathered ruffle and a little sewing machine work for a lovely accent pillow.

Because we will need specific fabrics and laces for this project, a fabric/lace kit will need to be purchased when you come to this class. Kit Fee: \$20.00 (payable at class)

Bring To Class:

Threads

- 3 cones of white serger thread
- 1 cone of machine embroidery thread (such as Isacord) in your choice of color. This will be the accent color for your pillow, showing on the pintucks and ruffle edge.

Serger Set-Up

Have your serger threaded for a 3-thread serge stitch using the right needle only. Have the
white cone thread in the right needle and lower looper, and the machine embroidery thread in
the upper looper. We will use the remaining white cone thread for a later part of the project.

Supplies

- 4 yds of 1/8" − 3/8" wide ribbon to match the embroidery thread
- 18" square of fabric for the inside pillow form cover. This also should match or blend with the machine embroidery thread. It can be a quilting cotton, batiste, silk, etc.

- Optional A piece of batting that is 18" wide and quite long. This will be rolled up to create the pillow form. It could be several pieces rolled together; the idea is to end up with a roll that is about 18" in diameter. You can do this at home rather than at class, if you wish.
- Loop turner, if you have one (see photo, right). We will have them to purchase at the class.
- Basic sewing/serging supplies
