

LINDON CITY ANNUAL MEMORIAL DAY CEREMONY



All are invited to attend as the community of Lindon will hold our annual Memorial Day ceremony honoring all Lindon veterans for their military service. Twenty five new names will be added to the “Monument to Freedom” with each individual name being read and recognized. Located in the Lindon City Cemetery, the Monument is of spectacular gray granite, in the shape of a five point star facing skyward. Weighing in at 18 tons of solid granite and standing over 15 feet tall with its crowning Minuteman statue, the monument is an impressive tribute to those both living and deceased who have served our city, state and country.

Each point of the star is dedicated to a branch of the U.S. Military and bears the bronze seal of that service. The Monument was built with donations from Lindon City residents and much of the work on the monument, from the concrete work, to the creation of the bronze sculpture, was done by Lindon City residents or natives in an awe inspiring display of community spirit.

Each year the Lindon City Police Department with the full support of the Mayor and City Council, spearheads the effort to collect and authenticate the names of those who have done so much to preserve our freedoms. This effort culminates each Memorial Day as a spectacular, one hour program is held with a special message from an honored veteran, patriotic music by a Lindon Youth Choir, the reading of the role of honor, a 21-gun salute followed by the playing of Taps and the solemn placing of a traditional wreath upon the monument by an honored guest. Please join us for what will become a family tradition, as a memorable and patriotic start to your Memorial Day celebrations.
