TRIBUTE TO BRENT STUART

Brent started working for the City on October 29, 2002, as the Building Inspector. He has worked for three Mayors, Craig Kendell, Mike Keyes, and Sue Bybee. When the mandate came down that the cities had to comply with the stormwater regulations Brent helped by doing those nasty stormwater inspections along with his visits and inspections.

Brent has contributed valuable insights and new perspectives to discussions with the City and has shared his time and knowledge with his co-workers and the citizens of Uintah.

ANIMAL CONTROL

Many of us chose to live in Uintah because of the rural, small town feel of our little city. One aspect of this is being able to have animals like cows, llamas and horses.

City Ordinance No. 213-12 is the city ordinance that regulates the number and types of animals that may be kept in certain zones. All non-domesticated animals are assigned a number of points with a cap of the number of points allowed in each residential zone. This city ordinance also includes area restrictions that indicate how close animals may be kept to adjacent lots.

Please review how many animals you have and ensure the distance to adjacent lots and dwellings is maintained. Also, please be courteous to your neighbors and take efforts to minimize smells and sounds that accompany animals.

Also, in the last couple of months the city has had two instances of animals being shot. City ordinance No. 207-12 prohibits the discharge of fire arms within city limits. Both the dog and the cat recovered.

If you have problems please don't take it into your own hands, call the proper authorities. Any concerns with animal control please contact the city offices or Gordon Cutler (801-476-0356).

SCOUT HOUSE UPDATE

Scout House is proceeding; opening up of the rooms all the way through on the north side makes a wonderfully large room. A few modifications to the plan will now result in the glass "store front" entrance being located on the east side of the building. City Council News

Last Tuesday we received the com-
pleted plans for the proposed fire
station remodel. We have concerns
over the cost estimate, and to set
everyone's mind at ease we are not
jumping to start this project at this
time.

The grant that was received for the
design of the fire station was submit-
ted during Mayor Kendell's term.

There are concerns with the current
structure that need to be fixed and
the fire station should qualify as an
essential facilities for emergency
management which our fire station
doesn't.

The design that we received has
many great features that can be
eliminated to make the cost more
reasonable. Since our department
is a volunteer department things like
the room which was indicated as a
bedroom could be used as storage
or as the command room for emer-
gencies. There are several changes
that could be made to make the
plans more usable for our situation.

The other big issue is how do we
fund such a project. We do not have
a pot of money laying around that
would enable us to move forward on
the project.

More work will need to be done on
the design, needs and wants, and
potential funding.
