HELP IS NEEDED!!!


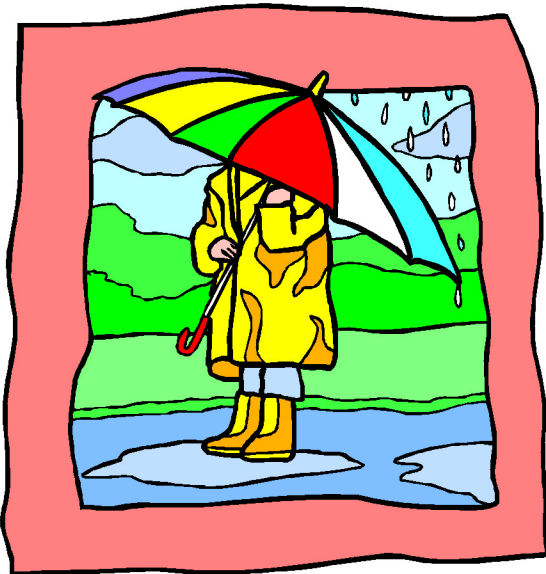
We need to have helpers with setup and also manning the sale on Friday and Saturday.

New Arrivals

Books:

The Power Trip by Jackie Collins. A luxurious yacht in the Sea of Cortez, a birthday cruise for one of the world's most beautiful women, and an invitation no one can refuse. A tropical getaway with a group of global power-hungry elites turns sour when they find out maybe they don't control as much of the world as they thought. "Sex, glamour, and a glimpse into the lifestyle of the rich and famous... Classic Collins at her best."—Booklist

Alex Cross, Run by James Patterson. All of Washington, D.C., is in a panic over a breakout of mysterious killings. Detective Alex Cross's investigations are going nowhere, and he's too focused on the cases to notice that someone has been watching him – and will stop at nothing until he's dead. 20th in the series.

Audiobooks:

My Beloved World by Sonia Sotomayor. An instant American icon – the first Hispanic on the U.S. Supreme Court – tells the story of her life before becoming a judge. With candor and intimacy, Sonia Sotomayor recounts her life from a Bronx housing project to the federal bench, a progress that is testament to her extraordinary determination and the power of believing in oneself.

The Man Who Saved the Union by H.W. Brands. A masterful biography of Ulysses Grant, the Civil War general and two-term president who saved the Union twice, on the battlefield and in the White House. He was a beloved field commander, played it straight with the American Indians, and was the last presidential defender of black civil rights for nearly a century.

The Liberator by Alex Kershaw. The true story of the bloodiest, most dramatic march to victory of WWII: the wartime odyssey of a maverick U.S. Army officer and his infantry unit as they fought for over 500 days to liberate Europe. From the invasion of Italy to the gates of Dachau, Felix Sparks rose from captain to colonel on the battlefield. He lost his entire company at Anzio, and an entire battalion in the Vosges. Yet he survived and led the final charge to Bavaria to hunt down Hitler.

The Hobbit. Tolkein's first tale of Middle Earth, the ring and Golum.

Les Miserables. The 2012 Academy Award winner with Hugh Jackman, Anne Hathaway and Russell Crowe.

The 10th Kingdom. Venture to Nine Kingdoms where fairy tales and magic are brought to life. The mini-series of 3 discs.
