# Don't miss an EMERGENCY MESSAGE! Register your cell phone now!!!

The Logan/Cache Emergency Reverse 9-1-1 notification system has the ability to send mass telephone notifications to the residents of Cache County in the event of an emergency. Emergency notifications can be delivered to your home phone, work phone, or cell phone if an emergency occurs in your area. Notifications are currently delivered automatically to landline phones for Qwest customers, and to cell phone customers who have completed the registration process on their website.

If you do not have a Qwest phone line, register your cell phone(s) on line at 911-loganutah.org.

If you do have a Qwest phone line, to ensure you receive ALL emergency messages in your area, whether you are home or not, register your cell phone.

### DO YOU NEED A RECYCLING SCHEDULE FOR 2012?

Go to loganutah.org. On the right side of the screen you will see "2012 recycle collection calendar". Click on it and select to print a color version or black and white version of the calendar. Tape the calendar inside a cupboard door so you will always know when to put the blue can out by the curb by 7:00 am for collection.

Proof of your animals rabies shot will need to be provided to the City, so make an appointment to get needed vaccinations.



NOTE: Dog license renewals are available ONLINE. The only reason you won't be able to pay online is if you don't have a current rabies certificate on file.

Library Board Meeting will be held Wednesday, February 8th. This is an open meeting.



# Message from the Public Works Department:

We would like to remind you to please make sure you are shoveling sidewalks during and after snowfall. Please do not push or shovel snow out into the streets.

#### **City Ordinance reads:**

- 7-1-2, A: Failure to Remove Unlawful: It shall be unlawful for the owner, occupant, lesser, or agent of any property, abutting on a paved sidewalk, to fail to remove, or have removed from such paved sidewalk, all hail, snow, or sleet hereon within a reasonable time after such snow, hail, or sleet has fallen.
- 7-1-2, B: Depositing in Gutter Unlawful: It shall be unlawful for any person removing snow from the sidewalk, to deposit snow, dirt, leaves, or any other material, in the gutter so as to clog or prevent the free flow of water therein.
