

## "Apples For Sale" Block

I hope you are enjoying the Blog Hop Harvest as much as I am. I want to Thank Rhonda, from Farmhouse Threads for inviting me to be part of the fun.

I used the new Valdani Wool Floss. I carry every color of Valdani, Pearl Cotton, 3 & 6 Strand Floss, & Wool Floss. Diamond Textiles is the background fabric. If you don't know what they are, you are missing an awesome line of fabrics. I have over 250 bolts of these fabrics. I whipped stitched all the parts down. I stitched 4 rows of X's across the Basket. I used a running stitch to make the apple stems and the letters in the sign. Nothing too hard.

We used 2 fabrics in the background to give it a table cloth look.

Cut Bottom Fabric 4" X 12 1/2"

Cut Top Fabric 9" X 12 1/2"

Cut the Apple Sign Cream Wool 2" X 3" rectangle

I numbered the apples 1-5 starting in the basket, #5 sits by itself.

I use the same brown wool for the Sign post, Basket Handles & Rim
