BURN WINDOW

The burn window will open on March 1st through May 30th.

Please remember to get a burn permit before burning. There is no charge for the permit. You can receive a permit by going

to the city website, www.ferroncity.org (click on the city documents tab).

It will link you to the Utah Air Quality web page where you fill out the permit. If you are unable to do the permit on your own, please call or come to city hall and we will be happy to help you.

It is important that you have a permit. If you do not have one and your fire gets away from you, you may be responsible for any costs incurred in fighting the fire.

Don't forget to turn your clocks forward 1 hour on March 12th!
