Copper and brass sheeting – 24 – 26 gauge sheeting

Copper foil - .002 .003 thick

Mesh and screen – copper, stainless and brass variety of gauges and mesh count

Wire – 26, 24, 20, 22 and 18 gauge copper, tinned copper and craft Beads
