Fabric Requirements:

Featuring Soft Dreams Collection from P&B Textiles

- Large Medallions-Blue (SDRE 592 B) 1/3 yard
- Large Medallions-Yellow (SDRE 592 Y) 1 yard
- Ombre-Blue (SDRE 598 B) 2 1/3 yards
- Dots-Blue/Green (SDRE 597 B) 1 yard
- Butterflies-Blue (SDRE 594 B) 1 yard
- Stripe-Blue (SDRE 593 B) 1 1/3 yards
- White (CSNE W) 2 yards

You will also need:

- 4 yards of fabric for the backing
- 68" x 72" piece of batting
- GO! Strip Cutter 2 1/2" (2" Finished) die
- GO! Half Square Triangles 2 1/2" (2" Finished) die
- Basic Sewing Supplies & Tools



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Please read all instructions before starting. Measurement on borders are approximate. Measure your quilt top before cutting.
Use a 1/4" seam allowance unless otherwise noted.

Cutting Instructions:

Large Medallions – Blue (SDRE 592 B) (A)

- Cut one 8 1/2" x Width of Fabric (WOF) strip. Sub-cut one 8 1/2" x 12 1/2" strip.

Large Medallions – Yellow (SDRE 592 Y) (B)

- Cut two 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut four 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" strips;
- Cut two 1 3/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut two 1 3/4" x 26" strips;
- Cut two 1 3/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut two 1 3/4" x 24 1/2" strips;
- Cut two 1 3/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut two 1 3/4" x 38" strips;
- Cut two 1 3/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut two 1 3/4" x 36 1/2" strips;
- Cut three 1 3/4" x WOF strips. Sew the strips end to end with a diagonal seam and cut two 1 3/4" x 50" strips;
- Cut three 1 3/4" x WOF strips. Sew the strips end to end with a diagonal seam and cut two 1 3/4" x 48 1/2" strips.

Ombre – Blue (SDRE 598 B) (C)

- Cut two 1 3/4" x 62" strips from the Length of Fabric (LOF);
- Cut two 1 3/4" x 60" strips from the LOF;
- Cut five 2 1/2" strips from LOF for the binding;
- Cut one 5 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut four 5 1/4" squares;
- Cut one 3 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut eight 3 1/4" squares;
- Cut two 8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut into five 7" x 8" rectangles. Use the rectangles to cut fifty-six 2 1/2" half-squares with the **GO! Half Square triangles-2 1/2" (2" Finished)**.

Dots – Blue/Green (SDRE 597 B) (D)

- Cut four 8 1/2" x WOF strips. Use these strips to cut ten 2 1/2" x WOF strips with the **GO! Strip Cutter- 2 1/2" strips (2" finished)**. Follow the directions and the **Go! Strip Cutter-2 1/2" strips (2" finished)** to cut the strips into ninety 45 degree diamonds.

Butterflies – Blue (SDRE 594 B) (E)

- Cut four 8 1/2" x WOF strips. Use these strips to cut ten 2 1/2" x WOF strips with the **GO! Strip Cutter- 2 1/2" strips (2" finished)**. Follow the directions and the **Go! Strip Cutter-2 1/2" strips (2" finished)** to cut the strips into ninety 45 degree diamonds.

Stripe – Blue (SDRE 593 B) (F)

- Cut two 5 1/4" x 55" strips from LOF;
- Cut two 5 1/4" x 50" strips from LOF.

White (CSNE W) (G)

- Cut one 5 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut into eight 5 1/4" squares;
- Cut one 3 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut into four 3 1/4" squares;
- Cut seven 8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut into twenty-six 7" x 8" rectangles Use the rectangles to cut (304) 2 1/2" half-squares with the **GO! Half Square triangles-2 1/2" (2" Finished)**.

Backing – (Your Choice)

- Cut one 38" x 44" piece for the backing



Block Assembly Instructions:

1. To cut the 45-degree Diamonds. Align each 2 ½" x WOF Fabric D strip with 45-degree line on the Go! Strip Cutter-2 ½" strips (2" finished) die. Align the 2 ½" strip on the die with the selvedge end slight over the first straight line. Trim the extra part of the strip (folded edge) from the other side of the die just past the opposite straight line (Fig. 1). Use the extra section of the strip to cut three more 45-degree diamonds. You should get nine diamonds per strip.

2. Repeat Step one with 2 ½" Fabric E strips to cut ninety 45-degree diamonds.

3. Sew one 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of one 8 ½" x 12 ½" rectangle. Sew one 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the rectangle to make the center block (Fig. 2).

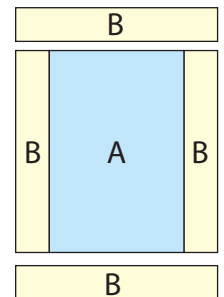

4. Place one 3 ¼" Fabric C square on the top left corner of one 5 ¼" Fabric G square, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 4). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam. Repeat to make eight GC Corner units.

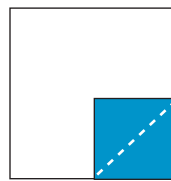

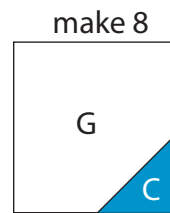

5. Repeat Step 4 with four 5 ¼" Fabric C squares and four 3 ¼" Fabric G squares to make four CG corner units (Fig. 5).

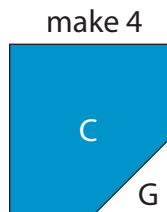

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6. Follow Figure 6 to sew one 2 ½" Fabric C triangle to the top of one 45-degree Fabric D diamond. Sew one 2 ½" Fabric C triangle to the bottom of the 45-degree Fabric D diamond. Repeat to make fourteen CDC units.

7. Follow Figure 7 to sew one 2 ½" Fabric C triangle to the top of one 45-degree Fabric E diamond. Sew one 2 ½" Fabric C triangle to the bottom of the 45-degree Fabric E diamond. Repeat to make fourteen CEC units.

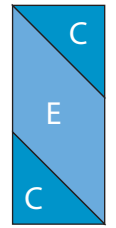

8. Sew one CDC unit and one CEC unit to make a Unit One square (Fig. 8). Repeat to make fourteen Unit One squares.

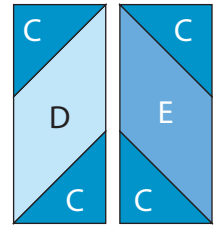

9. Follow Figure 9 to sew one 2 ½" Fabric G triangle to the top of one 45-degree Fabric D diamond. Sew one 2 ½" Fabric G triangle to the bottom of the 45-degree Fabric D diamond. Repeat to make seventy-six GDG units.

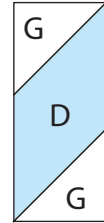

10. Follow Figure 10 to sew one 2 ½" Fabric G triangle to the top of one 45-degree Fabric E diamond. Sew one 2 ½" Fabric G triangle to the bottom of the 45-degree Fabric E diamond. Repeat to make fourteen GEG units.

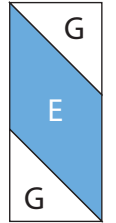

11. Sew one GDG unit and one GEG unit to make a Unit Two square (Fig. 11). Repeat to make fourteen Unit Two squares

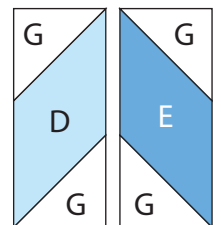

Quilt Top Assembly Instructions: Refer to Quilt Layout while assembling.

12. Sew together four Unit One squares to make one side border. Repeat to make a second border. Sew the side borders to the Center block.
13. Sew together three Unit One squares and two CG corner units to make the top border. Repeat to make the bottom border. Sew the border to the center block to make the quilt top.



14. Sew one 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 26" Fabric B strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
15. Sew together seven Unit Two squares to make one side border. Repeat to make a second side border. Sew the borders to the quilt top.
16. Sew six Unit Two squares and two GC corner units to make the top border. Repeat to make the bottom border. Sew the borders to the quilt top.
17. Sew one 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 38" Fabric B strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 36 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
18. Center one 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 55" Fabric F strip on one side of the quilt top. Start sewing the strip a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the top edge of the quilt top and stop a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
19. Repeat Step 19 to sew one 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 50 strip to the top and the bottom of the quilt top, making sure to stop and start $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each end of the quilt top.

20. To miter each corner, fold the quilt top on a diagonal wrong side together. This should line up the strip from adjacent sides (Fig. 12).

21. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 12) draw a 45-degree line out to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.

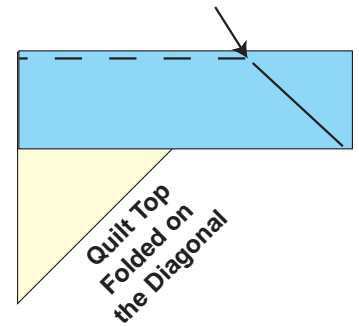
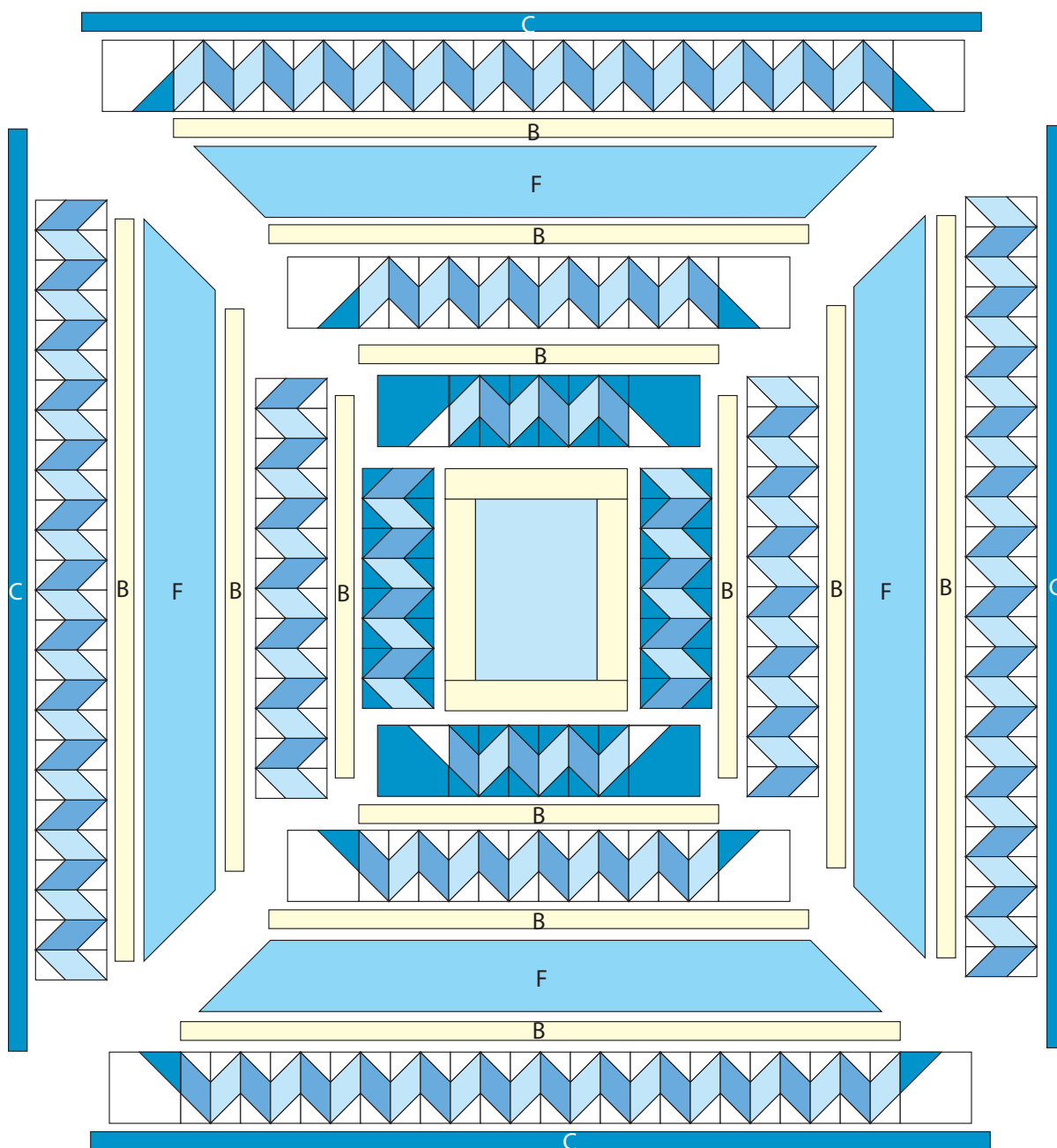

22. Sew one 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 50" Fabric B strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
23. Sew together thirteen Unit Two squares to make one side border. Repeat to make a second side border. Sew the borders to the quilt top.
24. Sew twelve Unit Two squares and two GC corner units to make the top border. Repeat to make the bottom border. Sew the borders to the quilt top.
25. Sew one 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 62" Fabric C strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.



- 26.** Layer and quilt as desired.
- 27.** Sew the five 2 ½" x LOF Fabric C strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 28.** Bind as desired.
