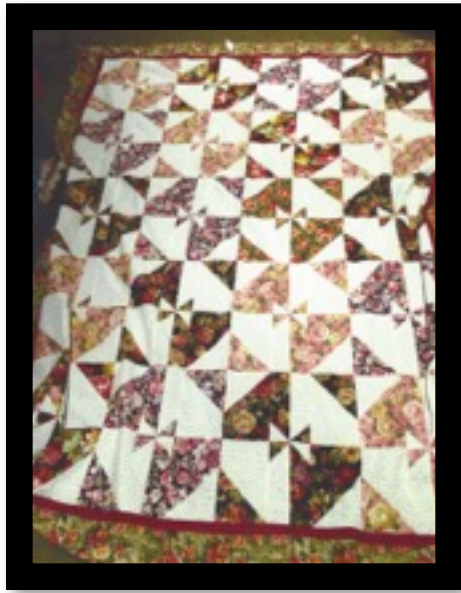

11-Free Motion Quilting

Free motion quilting can be intimidating! This short class will help you gain confidence to climb over the familiar “I can’t do that” feeling. Different methods of free motion quilting will be discussed and demonstrated, including tips to train that “muscle memory” you’ve heard about, and use of tricks that will make your work look so good to others. Each student will work on her own project, and will be able to take home samples of very easy but effective quilting patterns to perfect in your own sewing space. Also covered will be the use of purchased quilting stencils, or other methods of marking quilting lines.

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12-Back Basting Appliqué

Learn how to baste shapes in place for needle turn appliqué by working from the wrong side of the fabric. No marks on the front.

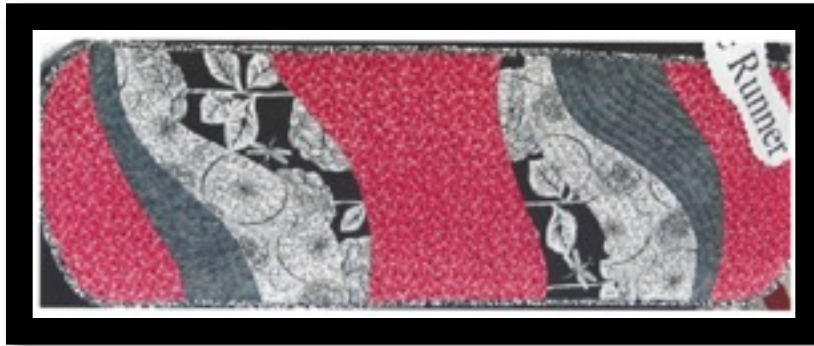

17-Art Quilting with Friends

An artistic twist on the Round Robin quilt. In this class, participants will work on each other's piece to make an art quilt for everyone. The participants will start out with a 9 inch block, fabric of their choice to go into making their piece, and a piece of purple fabric. Their block and fabric will go to the next person, but each participant will hold onto their purple fabric. The other quilter will add to the piece, using the fabric and adding a touch of their purple while you are working on the piece passed to you, also working with the original block, fabrics and adding some of your purple fabric. You can do anything you want to make the art piece: cut it, add blocks, add strips, add curves, add appliqué. You have only 1 hour and 15 minutes to work on it before it goes on to the next person. The class is all day with a lunch break. Bringing your lunch is recommended.

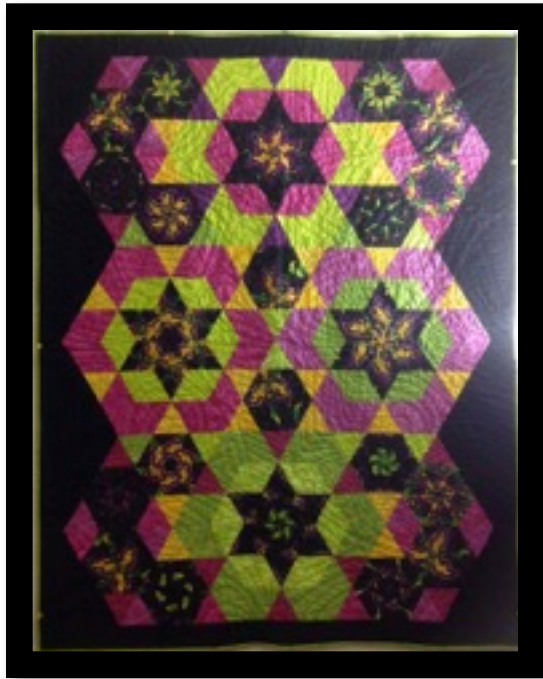

Kit Fee/Contents:

I will have a few kits available for \$30 each. Each kit will include already pattern-matched focus fabric and 6 coordinating accent fabrics. These kits will provide enough fabric to complete a 4-block quilt top similar to the class sample. These kits are assembled from leftover focus fabric and coordinating fabric selected to match the focus fabric so the stack of pattern matched fabric may show evidence of prior shape cutting. Each kit will include a bonus item such as an assembled setting triangle, extra fabric, or pre-cut pieces.

19-Free Motion-Quilting On Your Home Machine

This class will cover basic machine quilting: from choosing your quilt design to hands on quilting on your own sewing machine. Go beyond “stippling and meandering” to free form motifs and formal designs (requiring marking). Learn various methods of marking designs and lots of personal tips to make quilting on your home machine fun and easy. Ron will demonstrate how he handles larger sized quilts and share his philosophy on machine quilting. We’ll have fun. You can do this!

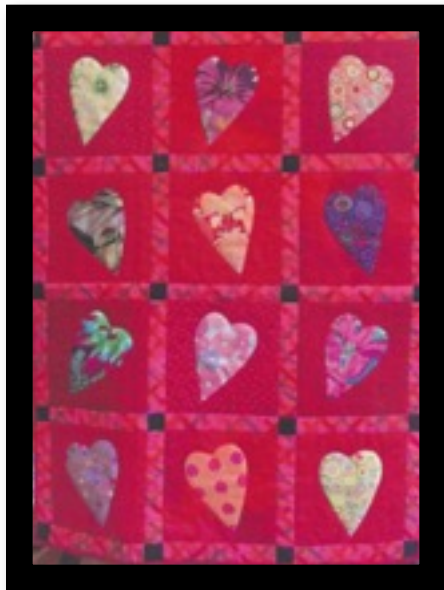
