I have lived in Delaware now for 4 years and before that, 3 years in Marietta, Georgia. I grew up in the northern suburbs of Chicago and while raising my two children now 27 and 29, we lived in a small town called Grayslake, Illinois. It was there I learned how to quilt about 20 years ago now.

I was interested in quilting and saw an ad in our park district flyer pertaining to a beginning quilt class. Unknown to me there was a quilt shop in town where the class was held, I had been watching quilt shows on PBS – Quilt in a day, Georgia Bonesteal, etc.. But was afraid of my rotary cutter it looked so easy, and so sharp! I had the supplies and went off to class. I worked Part-time and quilted, raised my kids and now have a huge stash and 1000 square feet of living space in our home now in Brandywine designated to quilting. I love it! I'm addicted and my husband totally supports me, he says its way better than drugs or gambling and every year or so he gets a new quilt.

My passion for teaching is so rewarding, I just love it when I see someone that has been struggling in a paper piecing class and all of a sudden they get it. There's no better feeling than that!
