

30s Sampler

Finished quilt size 80" x 80"

Finished block size 7 ¾" x 7 ¾"
(custom sized to match the
preprinted embroidery panels)



Yardage requirements: (Visit the online store at www.barbsfavorites.com)

1 fat quarter bundle of Vintage 30s Ruby's Treasures (or 30 Fat quarters of 21 prints and 9 solids)

1 McKim Studios Flower Garden panel

1 McKim Studios Farm Life panel

2 ½ yards of cream solid for background and border. (If making plain alternate blocks you will need 4 ½ yards including the border)

Optional: 1 yd print of choice for border (reduce the amount of cream needed by one yard)

¾ yard cream solid or print of choice for binding

Embroidery floss in colors to coordinate with the Vintage 30s prints (Barb's Ruby's Treasures designer thread packs include 10 colors of 6 strand embroidery floss to coordinate with the fabric collection.)

9" or 9 ½" square ruler with a diagonal line that extends into the corner for trimming the blocks (The 9 ½" x 9 ½" Omni Grid Ruler works well).

General info:

- There will be 41 pieced blocks that will alternate with the farm and flower panel blocks.
- The finished block size is 7 ¾" x 7 ¾", custom sized to match the size of the panel blocks.
- The first installment will be posted here at Barb's Favorites on July 1, 2017.
- The patterns will be posted in sets of 4 blocks as pdf downloads for 10 months.
- You may download each set for free for the first month that they are posted after which they will be available in my online store at a cost of \$5 for each set of 4.
- Month 10 will have 5 blocks.
- The 40 alternate panel blocks may be embroidered, painted, crayon tinted, or appliqued. Or the alternate blocks may be left blank.
- Since the project is designed to use the printed panel blocks the embroidery patterns are **not** offered as part of this BOM, however, you may order the patterns separately from www.McKimStudios.com (items 401 and 403).
